BILL HAYWOOD AT COTTAGE GROVE.

who doubt not that this man de-
spised the emblem of the American
eagle and the draped stars and
stripes which formed a border
around the room in which he de-
livered his harangue to a large
Cottage Grove audience, brought
out, not through the personality or
any sympathy for Haywood or his
cause, but through a morbid curi-
osity to see a man charged and
acquitted of a sensational, dastardly
murder and one very appropri-
ately termed an "undesirable citi-
zen" by the president of these
United States.

While Mr. Haywood laid great
stress upon the injustice of calling
the militia to any community dur-
ing "times of peace" at the same
time he related incidents concern-
ing clashes between union and non-
union men and strike breakers and
exhibited scars which he claimed
to have received in some of these
encounters, yet he termed this con-
dition of things "times of peace"
and denounced the government
for calling out the militia to quell
such peaceful indulgences.

LABOR NOT OPPOSED TO MILITIA.

On page 256 of the National
Guard Magazine for May 1909, is
found several letters over the sig-
natures of prominent union and
labor leaders taking a decidedly
different view of the militia and
National Guard from that held
and expressed by his nibs, Bill
Haywood. These letters, strongly
denying any opposition to these
military organizations are signed
by such prominent labor leaders as
Samuel Gompers, president Amer-
ican Federation of Labor; A. B.
Garretson, president Order Rail-
road Conductors; Peter W. Collins,
president Brotherhood Electrical
Workers and Geo. Preston, Gen-
eral Secretary Machinists Associa-
tion.

Haywood's visit to Cottage
Grove did not have a tendency to
help the cause of socialism in this
community.

A PORTION OF THE CASCADE COURT.
