In the role of the queen's maids, Miss Mary Mundy, Mrs. Lilyan Goodman, Miss Leah Perkins and Mrs. H. E. Inlow, sang their lines well and attended the queen with grace and charming pose.

The white haired high priest, Dr. Macy, and the age Jew, Hegai W. C. Conner, were prominent in the bass section of the chorus as well as several quartets and brief solos.

At the beginning of act five came the grand triumphal march and that most pleasing scene, the beautiful drill of the king's maidens before the royal court, which was most creditably performed by Misses Bessie Hutchinson, Lottie Beals, Mabel Rosenberg, Flora Phillips, Myrtle Kem and Veta Holderman, this act alone, being well worth the price of admission. This act concluded with the fall of Haman, crowning of Mordecai the Jew, as premier, the rejoicing of the Jews and the grand finale chorus, "Praise Ye the Lord."

All of the principal buildings of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition are grouped in close compass around the Cascades and Geyser Basin and the flower beds which line each.

The picture shows a view from the lower side of Geyser Basin, directly up the Court of Honor. On the right are seen the Palace of Manufactures, the Oriental and Hawaiian Buildings.
