COUNCIL PROHIBITS SALE OF NEAR BEER

The city council met in regular session Monday evening, all members being present except Bartels and Fischer.

Petitions signed by property owners and tenants asking for the paving of Main street were read. A remonstrance was also presented and read. A lively discussion both for and against paving followed. The petitions and remonstrance were referred to the street committee with a request for a report on the amount of front footage of the petitioners and those remonstrating to be presented at the next meeting.

Councilman Lawson reported that three acres of Cochran estate at the rock quarry could be bought for \$250 to supply rock for a crusher. The street committee was instructed to accept the proposition and secure a deed to this tract of land from the Cochrans.

Ordinances Nos. 227 and 228 referring to assessments for the improving of "A" and "D" streets were passed.

Ordinance No. 219, prohibiting the sale of near beer and other non-intoxicating malt liquors in the city of Cottage Grove, and providing penalties therefor, was passed by unanimous vote. Violators of this ordinance are subject to a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$250, imprisonment in default of payment.

Bids for the construction of a lateral sewer west from the Main on Third street, through blocks 8, 7 and 6 to J. E. Young's addition were opened. F. B. Phillips, \$948.50; H. C. Hart, \$787.27. Mr. Hart received the contract.

Bids for the improvement of East Second and part of East Locust streets were opened, the contract being awarded to H. Venske for \$788. The usual expense bills were allowed and ordered paid.
