A PASSENGER TRAIN GOES THROUGH BRIDGE

Ostrander will recover. The others most seriously injured are Price Rogers, jaw and left leg broken; Mrs. William Southworth, two ribs broken; Judge W. D. Foster, left thigh broken; F. H. Hall, left leg broken below knee.

The bridge did not burn as reported; neither did the engine topple into the river, though the car and tender is in the stream. The Oregon and Southeastern is owned by G. B. Hengen of New York. A. B. Wood, manager of the road, is on his way home from a business trip to Chicago.

The bridge was of the ordinary wooden type, with a 90-foot span, and crosses Row River about five miles east of Cottage Grove. Several picnic excursion trains had passed over the bridge Saturday previous to the wreck.

Work of clearing the debris is now well under way, an O. R. & N. wrecking train having arrived upon the scene yesterday.

INVESTIGATION PROCEEDINGS.

T. K. Campbell and George C. Goodale of the Oregon Railroad Commission, arrived here Sunday to investigate the disastrous wreck. They are making a thorough investigation, examining many witnesses and road employees and their report will be awaited with interest.

WRECK SUSPENDS BUSINESS.

The big Brown Lumber Co. saw mill and planer in this city and several mills and logging camps on Row River are forced to suspend operations pending the rebuilding of the bridge and resuming of operations on the road, which however, will probably be accomplished within two weeks, as a large force of men is being put to work on the new structure.

WRECK NOTES.

Several injured upon being asked if the water was cold, said they could not remember.

Ernest Gill was riding on the steps of the coach and escaped injury, just how he does not know.

It was a most fortunate misfortune, little less than a miracle so far as the escape of the passengers is concerned.

Excursions were run out to the wreck all day Sunday, and it was the common expression: "How could anyone succeed in getting out of that tangled, partly immersed wreckage alive?"

A. J. Armstrong, the local photographer was early on the scene of the wreck and was exhibiting 8x10 photographs of the disaster on the street long before midnight to eager, curious throngs—a great stroke of enterprise on his part.

The Row River sawmill men have generously offered to donate the necessary timbers and furnish men to rebuild, free of charge to the O. & S. E. company, the railroad bridge which collapsed with such disastrous results last Saturday. This kindly proffer on the part of the heavy shippers of the road is much appreciated by the railroad company.

Jim Jeffries Party Will be Here.

All Walker has received word from Los Angeles that Jim Jeffries and party of friends will be here next September to take their usual hunting and fishing trip on the south fork of the McKenzie. Whether Big Jim meets the dusky pugilist Johnson or not, he is determined to come to Eugene this fall to take his hunt. Two of the party who were here last year have since died.—Register.

In a fit of insanity Saturday at Marquam, twenty miles south of Oregon City, Bert B. Garret placed a charge of dynamite under the kitchen of his house and blew himself, wife and daughter, Beulah, aged five into eternity. The explosion also perhaps fatally injured another daughter, Villa, who was in the upper portion of the house.

The tragedy occurred while Mrs. Garret and her daughter Beulah, were in the kitchen preparing breakfast. The little girl was instantly killed, as was Garret, who was blown thirty feet from the house against a tree, almost tearing off his head. The force of the explosion was so great that Garret's body was blown twenty feet beyond the tree.

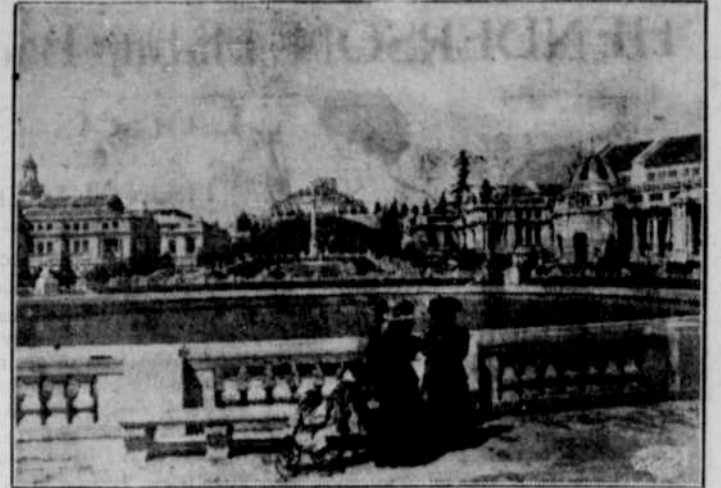

A VIEW OF THE COURT OF HONOR, A.-Y.-P. EXPOSITION, SEATTLE.

All of the principal buildings of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition are grouped in close compass around the Cascades and Geyser Basin and the flower beds which line each.

The picture shows a view from the lower side of Geyser Basin, directly up the Court of Honor. On the right are seen the Palace of Manufactures, the Oriental and Hawaiian Buildings. On the left are the European Exhibits and Alaskan Buildings. In the far center is the Central Government, which shows its incompleteness as it looked on April 15. On that date this was the heaviest piece of construction to be finished before the opening day of the Exposition and the contractors estimated that it would take them ten days to do the work.

Geyser Basin is in the foreground, and just beyond it show the steps in the Cascades.
