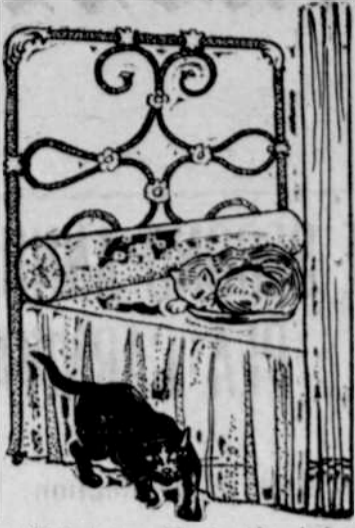


# IRON BEDS

#### REGARDING STREET BONDS.

There has lately been much talk about street improvement bonds and Cottage Grove not being in the street paving class, regarding which we quote the following legal authority:

The "Bancroft Act" was passed in 1893 and only applied to incorporated cities in this state having a population of 50,000. This provision is found in Section 2727 of Bellinger & Cotton's codes and statutes of the state of Oregon at page 909. In 1901 this section was amended to make the act apply to all cities and towns having a population of 2,500 or more. This act is found at page 373 of the Session laws of 1901. This section as amended by the act of 1901 was further amended by an act of the Session of 1905, making the act apply to ANY INCORPORATED CITY OR TOWN WITHIN THIS STATE.

This act is found at Page 87 of the Session laws of the session of 1905 and is known as Chapter 25.

Section 2727 of the Code, as amended by the act of 1905, was further amended by the legislature of 1907 which reenacted all the section amended by the laws of 1905 and added a proviso to it, but making no change in the provision making the act applicable to all incorporated cities and towns.

#### AS TO THE CHARTER.

Section 13 of Chapter XI, of the City Charter, of the city of Cottage Grove, Ore., (the charter passed at the special session of the legislative assembly of 1903) provides: "Section 13. The common council shall not in any one year, OUTSIDE OF INDEBTEDNESS FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS and the construction and repair of sewers, create indebtedness for current expenses of said city in excess of the sum of \$1,000."

It will therefore be seen that the 2,500 population clause of the old act regarding incorporated cities has been amended and that today no population requirement is made.
