**Climatic and Market Conditions Ideal For Poultry
Raising—Some of the Breeds and Breed-
ers—Local Poultry Association**

Cottage Grove poultry raisers
and fanciers supply foundation
stock, as well as eggs for hatching,
to poultrymen throughout the Pa-
cific Northwest; orders being
booked and filled as far east as
Idaho and Colorado, while Eastern
Oregon and Washington as well
as northern California furnishes
an excellent market for the Cot-
tage Grove fancy and utility pou-
try products which are quite ex-
tensively advertised in the poultry
journals.

A setting of 15 eggs from pure
bred stock brings from \$1.50 to \$5
while good foundation stock of the
popular utility breeds bring readily
from \$5 to \$10 per pair. During
the breeding months of March and
April many local breeders average



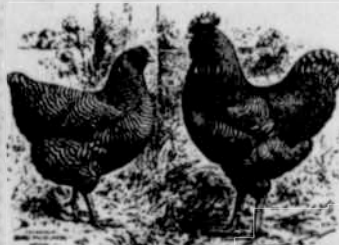

from \$100.00 to \$200.00 per month
from the sale of stock and pure
bred eggs. These breeders fatten
and sell their culled or off colored
birds in the local market receiving
from 10 cents to 18 cents per pound
therefor.

Egg prices in the local market
ranges from 15 to 50 cents per
dozen, rarely going below 25 cents
per dozen for assorted fresh eggs.
What is meant by "assorted" eggs
is that the brown, white and
speckled eggs are assorted, each
variety by themselves.

The breeds represented here and
being found the most profitable for
eggs and meat are the Barred,
White and Buff Rocks; Buff and
White Orpingtons; Golden, White,
Silver and Columbian Wyandottes;
Black, Buff and White Langshans;
Salmon Faveroles; Buff Cochins;
Buckeye Reds; Black Javas;
Brown, Buff and White Leghorns;
English Gray Dorkings; Silver
Spangled Hamburgs; Houdans;
Cornish Indian Games; Rhode
Island Reds; White and Black
Minorcas, and others, besides
turkeys, geese and ducks.

Most poultrymen raise their own
green feed, consisting of clover,
kale, sunflower and cabbage, which

grows luxuriantly here. The
grains and mashes consist prin-
cipally of wheat, corn, oats and rolled
barley, more of the former being
fed and which can be purchased
in the fall at from 75 to 85 cents
per bushel, but which later com-
mands a price of \$1.00 to \$1.25
per bushel, corn 1 to 2 cents per
pound.

Mashes are made from wheat
bran and shorts with a small quan-
tity of cracked corn added, this is
an inexpensive yet nourishing food.
Our local commission merchants
and the Portland dealers supply
the principal market for which as
stated 10 to 18 cents per pound is
paid for old stock and 20 to

35 cents paid for broilers and fryers.
Eggs 15 to 50 cents per dozen.

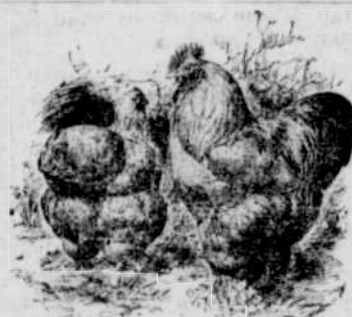
Cottage Grove boasts of a live
poultry association known as the
Calapooia Poultry Association.
This organization holds an annual
exhibition, and works collectively

as well as individually for the pro-
motion of all causes which lead to
the improvement of poultry rais-
ing and marketing. Under the
auspices of this association the best
poultry exhibits ever shown were
held in Cottage Grove up to 1908
when the Portland exhibition out-
did the Calapooia Association, but
plans are complete for holding an
exhibition in Cottage Grove this
year which will without doubt re-
gain for this section the honor of
having the best poultry exhibit
ever given in the Pacific North-
west.

More prizes have been captured
by poultry breeders from the Cot-
tage Grove section than from any
like area in the west. Climatic
conditions too, enter greatly into
the raising of fine poultry stock.
There being no thunder storms, or
sudden changes from heat and

cold, the young chicks are easier
cared for than in the eastern sec-
tions afflicted by cloudbursts, cy-
clones and blizzards.

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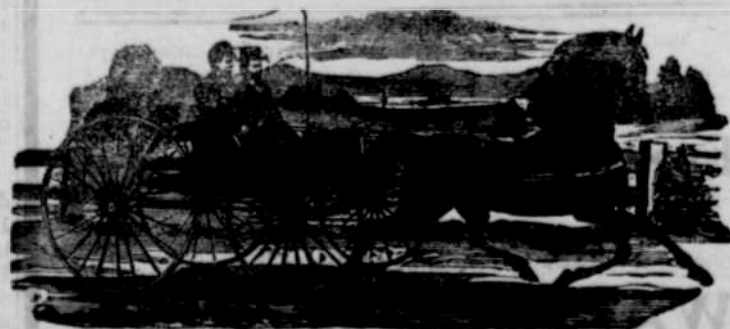


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
