The streets covered in this contract are Second street, from Washington to Lyon streets; and Ferry, Broadalbin and Ellsworth streets, from Second to Third streets.

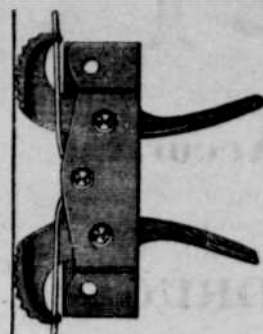
MARRIED.

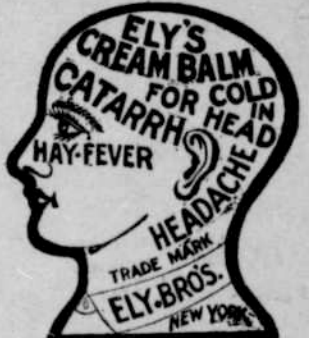
