In the seventh and eighth two more runs were garnered by the Colts. Clark got busy again in the ninth and sent the ball over the fence for the second home run netted the Groveites three more runs. Poultry Notes.

A pullet will not lay until reasonably well matured.

Don't use hens for hatching if you are farming poultry on a big scale.

Ducks lay in the morning and should not be turned out too early. Fowls thrive best in high, dry localities with a sandy soil.

Poultry farming is profitable if carried along on economical lines. Learn about poultry and put the knowledge obtained to actual use. Usually fresh laid eggs will hatch a little sooner than those kept for some time.

Don't fail to infuse fresh strains through the flock each season.

There is only one cure for egg eating and that is the ax.

Don't fail to keep shifting the chicken coops to fresh ground.

Don't buy your poultry feed at retail prices if you can secure it at wholesale rates.

Look out for lice in the roosting places; cleanliness is the best preventative.

One good breed of chickens on a farm is worth more than 10 different breeds.

With turkeys the one great essential is to keep the birds dry for the first five or six weeks.

Look out for hen lice; hens won't give good results in egg production if troubled with vermin.

Renew the nest material often; clean out all old straw before putting in the new.

Don't forget that a wry tail is a sure sign of a weak constitution.

The high price of feed is causing many an amateur poultrman to give up the business. Raise your own kale and green feeds.

Very little land is required, or you can sprout oats by putting them in boxes and moistening them every day and keeping them covered with wet sacks. This is a cheap feed and serves for green feed and grain both.
