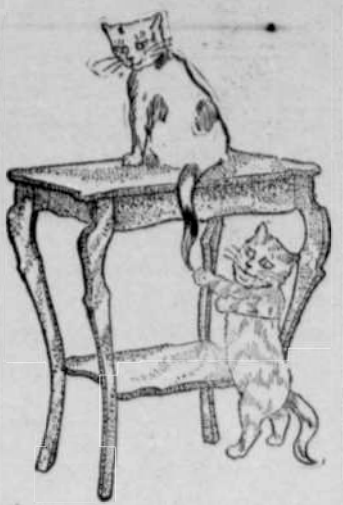

JOSEPH FURAY DRAWS FLATHEAD CLAIM NO. 1

Spokane, August 12.—The greatest of the three famous Indian land drawings began shortly after 9:30 o'clock this morning in the big wire cage that has been erected just a few rods from the shore at Couer d'Alene, Idaho. Six thousand numbers are being drawn today to decide who shall have a chance to procure one of the 2,500 land claims on the Flathead Indian reserve in northwestern Montana. Today 1500 names are to be chosen, and Friday and Saturday will complete this part of the work. Two thousand names were drawn for the Flathead Indian reservation, Joseph Furay, of Warsaw, Indiana, being the first picked out in the thousands of applications. Furay is 33 years of age, and weighs 200 pounds. After the first name was drawn the proceedings were perfunctory.
