Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Carlisle of Cottage Grove were London visitors Sunday.

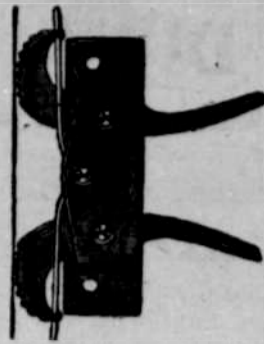
Mr. and Mrs. Frank Rhone, of Eugene, are recent arrivals on the camp grounds at the Springs.
