### W. E. VAUGHAN A GREAT ENTERTAINER

The Armory Theater was comfortably filled with people Thursday evening in anticipation of a few hours of mirth and enjoyment and no one went home disappointed. W. E. Vaughan the great southern impersonator and soloist is a whole show within himself, being particularly humorous and his portrayals are life-like and admirably rendered. As an imitator of the old negro dialect he is not excelled. He was reared in Dixie, in southern Tennessee, and can talk like the real southern negro, as was thoroughly demonstrated in his interpretation of "Brer Rabbit an' de Skeeters." His "Proposing to Marguerite" was well worth the price of admission, while his concluding number, "Old Ironsides" was very amusing. He does not depend upon costuming or make-up for his success, but upon his naturalness, of which nature has endowed him with an abundance. He has a clear lyric tenor voice, and interspersed his program with pleasing vocal selections, Miss Georgetta Berg of this city accompanying him on the piano. During an interlude Messrs Anderson and the Misses Anderson favored the audience with a beautiful mixed quartet and responded to an encore. Mr. Vaughan is making a flying tour of the coast appearing upon the stage only at Los Angeles, San Francisco, Cottage Grove, Lewiston, Idaho, and thence to the Yellowstone Park, where he will see the sights and then go home. He is booked by the Thomas Lyceum Bureau, of Springfield, Mo., and is certainly a big attraction and a grand entertainer. He appeared at Cottage Grove under the auspices of the Epworth League, Martin Anderson having the entertainment in charge and acting as master of ceremonies.

### SUPREME COURT HOLDS BONDS VALID

Salem, Or., Aug. 24.—In an opinion written by Justice W. R. King the supreme court today upheld the constitutionality of the law under which the Port of Coos Bay was organized.

The case also decides the legality of the Port of Florence bonds, which were voted under the same law. It is stated that this issue of \$100,000 of bonds has already been sold and they will at once proceed with the projected improvements at the mouth of the Siuslaw.

In the Coos Bay case the bond issue will be \$500,000, and work will proceed there on an extensive scale at once.

### HILL ROAD HAS RIGHT OF WAY

Portland, Aug. 24.—The Oregon Trunk Railway, which has the financial support of James J. Hill, won the contest with the Deschutes Railway Company, a Harriman subsidiary company, in the United States district court today, when Judge Bean overruled the demurrer of the Harriman road. The court also issued an order forbidding the Harriman people going upon the 60 miles of contested right-of-way up the Deschutes canyon in Central Oregon, and it is stated the injunction will stand until the final determination of the suit.

The application of the Harriman lawyers asking that the Hill road be similarly enjoined pending the adjudication of the case was refused.

### O. N. G. RIFLE TEAM SO FAR IN 21ST PLACE

Camp Perry, O., Aug. 23.—Bulletins posted tonight show the Oregon National Guard team ahead of 28 of the 49 competing teams. Today's firing was at 200 and 600 yards, the difficult ranges remaining for tomorrow.

Oregon men are confident of passing at least ten teams more today. Sergeant Stevens, of Portland made a perfect score of 50 today. Corporal Romaine and Sergeant Charlie White each scored 48. The team average was 45.

At the end of the second (600-yard) stage of the National Rifle Team match, the United States navy is ahead with 1081, but Massachusetts is crowding hard with 1075 and New York with 1070. On the 200-yard shoot which opened the match, the Navy led, closely pushed by the Annapolis cadets, while at 600 yards the New York team, which came here with only about a week's practice at Sea Girt, tied the Navy for high score and pulled up from ninth to third place.

### OREGON TEAM TWENTIETH.

Camp Perry, O., Aug. 25.—At the conclusion of the National team match today the Oregon riflemen had a hard fight against the United States service teams. All are remaining for the National individual match and will start home on Friday or Saturday. The pistol match will conclude the National matches. Only about half of the Oregon team will remain for it. Landing in fifth place in Class B means that the Oregon team finished 20th in the entire list of teams competing. Had the team finished 15th or higher it would have been placed in Class A. Last year the Oregon team attained this coveted honor, standing 13th in the complete list.
