**DAVENPORT SAYS
WIFE NAGGED HIM**

New York, Aug. 31.—Charging
desertion, Mrs. Homer Davenport,
wife of the famous cartoonist and
artist, has fulfilled her threat and
brought suit for divorce against
her husband. She demands alim-
ony of \$600 monthly and counsel
fees amounting to \$750.

In filing an answer to his wife's
suit today Davenport says that he
left his wife on January 14 last be-
cause of her nagging disposition.

He declares that Mrs. Davenport
was extremely jealous, wanted to
accompany him everywhere, and
made his life miserable by constant
nagging.

The artist admits his obligation
to his wife's children and offers to
give her \$250 each month if she
will keep away from him.

Horses and Cows Burned at Roseburg

Roseburg, Oregon, August 28.—
Fire originating in G. W. Rapp's
livery stables, and which raged for
4 hours before being controlled, de-
stroyed \$22,000 worth of property
in the business district last night.
Seventeen horses and two cows
perished in the stables. The insur-
ance covers about 3/4 of the loss.
Two bricks and one cement block
building were gutted. The stable
was owned by Rapp, whose loss is
\$7,000. The bricks were owned by
H. Wollenberg and Mrs. Troxel.
The former's loss of \$2000 is insur-
ed, the latter's of \$4500 uninsured.
G. L. Flint, proprietor of the Ne-
vada rooming house, loss \$1200; to-
tal. Bert Aderton's rooming house
loss is \$1000; total. Mrs. Com-
stock's residence, loss \$2000; half
insured. The remainder of the
losses are divided among a dozen
other people.
