Rare Evergreen Trees.

On his return from the Bohemia mining district recently, S. B. Morss, the nurseryman, brought down several rare specimens of evergreen trees peculiar to that district, among which is the Silver and Lovely fir both of which have very dense foliage or needles which grow straight up from the stem as does also the large cone shaped burrs, of which there is an immense crop this season indicative of a hard winter, we are told—except for the chipmunk and squirrel. These trees are said to be the most symmetrical and beautiful of the evergreen family, many of which are found in the Cascade range in this state and especially in the Bohemia mining district east of Cottage Grove. Mr. Morss will plant in his nursery the seed obtained from the burrs or cones which he gathered in the mountains and will endeavor to grow some of these beautiful evergreens for ornamental purposes and will add them to his list of nursery stock.

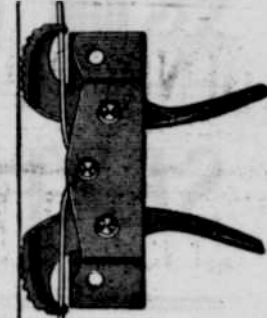
