Making Good Collection of Taxes.

An average of \$1500 per day for
 the past four or five days is being
 collected on the last half of taxes
 at the sheriff's office and before
 that the amount ran up to about
 \$1000 per day for several days.
 It looks now as though there
 would not be more than \$8000 or
 \$10,000 delinquent in a total taxa-
 tion of \$433,000, which is a very
 good collection.

Penalty After Monday.

 first Monday in October, a ten per
 cent penalty will be added and in-
 terest will be charged up at the
 rate of 12 per cent from April 1,
 last.

 townsman, J. D. Cochran, who is
 now located at Freewater, Eastern
 Oregon:
 "Editors Leader—Please change
 the address of my paper to Free-
 water, R. F. D., Oregon. You
 see I am still in Oregon and expect
 to be until after "Nesmith county"
 is created, at any rate. Should you
 visit this part of the state stop off
 at Locust Station, walk 250 yards
 east and you will find where I live.
 I have a well improved fruit farm
 with ten acres in peaches, prunes,
 cherries, apples and grapes. I
 have some Idaho pears and Chest-
 nut Rose grapes on exhibition at
 Pendleton. This is a great coun-
 try for fruit, the best I ever saw.
 Some people here are making as
 much as \$400 to \$500 per acre on
 well cultivated strawberry fields.
