The new management of West-
 ern Oregon has purchased the
 printing outfit of the Courier and
 consolidated it with the plant of
 the Western Oregon. The Lead-
 er also made a similar investment
 last week when it bought from
 W. B. Cooper, the real estate deal-

**CITY COUNCIL
 DELIBERATIONS**

(FROM PAGE ONE)

Following is the Council pro-
 ceedings in brief:

A petition was presented, read
 and granted providing for the hold-
 ing of a special election on
 Wednesday, Oct. 20, 1909, to sub-
 mit to the people the proposition of
 voting \$100,000 bonds for the pur-
 pose of increasing the city's water
 supply by bringing in Lang creek
 water. The election judges and
 clerks serving at the late special
 election will serve at this special
 election.

The remonstrance against the
 proposed improvement of west
 Fourth street from A to D streets,
 McFarland's addition, was accept-
 ed. It was stated that it would be
 wise to provide sewerage to
 drain surface water from that part
 of town before the street was
 graded, and the street commis-
 sioner was instructed to devise ways
 and means to dispose of surface or
 flood water in that part of town.

A communication from the War-
 ren Construction Co. bearing on
 street grading was deferred for ac-
 tion until the next regular meeting.

A remonstrance against the pas-
 sage of business license ordinance
 was accepted, and upon presenta-
 tion of this ordinance for final pas-
 sage the ordinance was defeated,
 but one vote being in its favor,
 that of Councilman Bartels.

Councilman Atkinson reported
 that the delay in the repair of the
 Curriu footbridge was due to his
 inability to secure the needed lum-
 ber, which, however, will soon be
 placed on the ground and the re-
 pairs completed.

The consideration and final dis-
 position of the mayor's veto of the
 street paving ordinance was de-
 ferred until the next regular meet-
 ing on account of the absence of
 Councilman Hogate. It is proba-
 ble that the veto will be sustained
 and a new ordinance passed at the
 next meeting patterned after the
 Portland paving ordinances.

The street commissioner was in-
 structed to notify all property
 owners on Main street from the de-
 pot to the river to build concrete
 sidewalks and curbs, except those
 who have already laid concrete
 sidewalks, within the next ninety
 days.

The city engineer was instructed
 to establish a permanent grade for
 paying Main street and building
 uniform concrete sidewalks and
 curbs, also to establish the radius
 of the street corners.

The light committee was em-
 powered to have lights placed, if
 found necessary, at the corner of
 John Durham's residence property,
 at the railroad crossing in front of
 Geo. Lea's home and at the corner
 of John Earl's home near the west
 side school.

The culvert at the railroad cross-
 ing on Fourth street was ordered
 repaired or replaced.

The usual bills for lights, mar-
 shal salaries and incidental ex-
 penses were audited and ordered
 paid.

Adjourned to meet Wednesday
 evening Oct. 20th.
