SOURCE OF GROVE'S NEW WATER SUPPLY

Cottage Groves votes October 20 on bonding the city in the sum of \$100,000 for the purpose of putting in a gravity system water supply. The source from which it is proposed to take the water is at a point 18 miles above the city, on Lang creek. It is thought the proposition will carry without much opposition. However, the Grove should have the water thoroughly tested for purity before beginning operations, thereby profiting by the mistakes other cities have made by spending money on surveys, etc., later to find the supply impure and unsafe. Lang creek's purity, coupled with sufficient supply is the first essential in Cottage Grove's proposed gravity system.—Eugene Register.

The Register's suggestion, while timely and good, is only calling attention to a matter which was thoroughly investigated long ago by Cottage Grove's aldermen, the purity and low temperature of Lang creek making it the choice of several water supply propositions presenting themselves to Cottage Grove. As has been said before, the source of Lang creek may be traced to the frozen gorges and crevices at the rugged base of old Mt. June, and its pure, crystal waters leap and play over great boulders down through the deep, dark, mossy canyons of the fir clad Cascade forest reserve upon the banks of which stream is not found a single habitant until the Forest Rangers lodge is discovered nestling in the dense forest, about one mile above the mouth of the creek at about the point where it is proposed to tap the creek with a twelve inch pipe line from Cottage Grove. There could be no more ideal source of water supply secured by any Oregon town, as Lang Creek traverses a wild, rugged and uninhabited timbered country and has its source in perpetual ice and snow beds at the base of a great mountain, snow clad the greater part of the year.

Notice is hereby given that special election will be held in the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, on **Wednesday, October 20, 1909.**

for the purpose of voting upon the question, "Shall the Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, issue and sell bonds of said city to an amount not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$100,000) said bonds to run 25 years and bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually; the purpose of said bonds being for the construction of a pipe line for a municipal water system, the water to be taken from what is known as Lang Creek at a point near the line of the Forest Reserve on said Creek, and to connect with the present water system of said city."

The polls will be open for the purpose of said election from 9 o'clock in the morning until 12 o'clock noon, and from one o'clock until five o'clock in the afternoon of said day.

Tom Allen's shop is the voting place in the First Ward and R. M. Veatch is designated as judge and J. C. Wallace and J. K. Barrett, judges and clerks of said election in the First Ward.

The Council room in the city hall is the voting place in the Second Ward, and O. Veatch is designated as judge and J. M. Durham and M. H. Martin, judges and clerks of said election in the Second Ward.

The store room in H. C. Schlee's building, on the north side of Main street, near the bridge, is the polling place in the Third Ward and D. C. McFarland is designated as judge and C. F. Walker and J. E. Ostrander as judges and clerks of said election in the Third Ward.
