KEM—At the home of her sister, Mrs. Shinn in west Cottage Grove, Friday evening, Oct. 8, 1909, Miss Malinda Ann Kem, aged 30 years, 10 months and 1 day, of tuberculosis.
 Deceased was a daughter of Mr. O. H. Kem and was born in Warren county, Indiana, Dec. 7, 1878. With her parents she resided in Illinois and also in Nebraska, and when about 17 years of age accompanied the family to Colorado where she lost her former good health and fell a victim to a nervous complication and pleurisy, the latter trouble effecting her lungs. She spent a season in Arizona and then came to Portland this state. In November soon after Messrs Kem and Shinn purchased the Cottage Grove electric light plant, the families came to this city to reside and at Christmas she assisted in preparing the Christmas decorations last winter, but soon thereafter was taken ill and failed in health rapidly until death relieved her sufferings.
 During all this time she remained pleasant and cheerful and bore her sufferings with the greatest fortitude. She was a great lover of flowers and the many floral tributes of friends presented during her illness was a great comfort and joy to her.
 The remains were taken to the Portland crematory Sunday and cremated, a beautiful rose bush growing in the well kept crematory grounds, was selected, according to custom, as a depository for the ashes, this rose thereafter bearing the name of the deceased, is so recorded, and carefully cared for thereafter.
