## RICH STRIKE MADE IN THE NORTH FAIRVIEW GOLD MINES

Free Gold Sparkles in the Ore—Also Rich in Lead and Copper—Five Foot Ledge Well Defined—Two Foot Free Gold

In local mining circles is manifested unusual interest in the recent very rich strike in the North Fairview mines in the Bohemia camp, 30 miles east of Cottage Grove.

The find was made this week and is nearly 200 feet below the tunnel where rich free gold ore was found four years ago. The ore is literally covered with gold and was found at the grass roots. The ledge is five feet wide, but only two feet of this ore so far is free gold. From this find to nearly 200 feet above this point gives the company one of the longest shoots of rich ore that has yet been found in quartz on the Pacific coast.

George W. McQueen, president of the company, arrived from the camp Thursday and brought some samples of the new find that fully bear out the reports. The ore is bright quartz with rusty or decayed seams and the gold can be seen all through the ore. The find is to be closely guarded, but developments are to be rushed forward as speedily as possible.

The ore is also found to be rich in copper and lead as well as free gold, and old conservative miners declare that North Fairview is the "making of a very rich and valuable mine." This new discovery is on the Champion side of the hill and the ledge has been traced and prospected for a distance of a mile and a half. This is the second largest and richest strike ever made in the Bohemia mining district, and may very easily, as predicted, develop into the richest strike ever made in this camp. **PALMER**—At the family home in West Cottage Grove, Wednesday Oct. 20, 1909, Jas. K. Palmer, aged 64 years, 6 months and 9 days, after a prolonged illness. Besides a wife deceased leaves two sons and four daughters to mourn their great loss. Funeral services were conducted from the family home at ten o'clock this Friday forenoon by Rev. Robt. Sutcliffe, interment in the I. O. O. F. cemetery. In Mr. Palmer's death the community loses a good, honest, upright citizen and the family a kind husband and father.

### AT THE MAYFLOWER.

Mr. McQueen Thursday, informed the Leader that while in Bohemia he visited the Mayflower group of mines operated by the Kelso Mining Company, of which W. P. Ely is manager and found them installing a fine new five stamp quartz mill. Mr. McQueen says they have enough excellent looking ore on the dump to keep their new mill running for a year and he predicts that this mine will soon become a regular producer.

### WEST COAST MINES.

In the West Coast Mines formerly the property of the Oregon Securities Co., has recently been opened a very rich ledge of gold and copper bearing quartz, which is intimated to carry values little less than the recent Fairview strike. The company, however, is very reticent regarding their new find, which was made in their champion mine on the eighth level, and is known to be very rich and the new discovery authentic.

### THE PRESIDENTIAL GROUP.

Al Churchill, President and manager of the Presidential Group of mines in Bohemia, is receiving the congratulations of his many mining friends upon the splendid showing which this season's work has brought about in his mines, which are declared to be very valuable property.

An old miner remarked last evening, "A turn in the tide has at last been reached in Bohemia and this camp will need no further exploitation. It will speak for itself. Bohemia will make good. It certainly looks that way and unprecedented lively times in this mining camp next season is assured."
