 carloads of milk; couldn't get
 enough milk.

It is announced that a new saw
 mill will be built on the Coquille
 River, probably near Coquille city,
 by a San Francisco syndicate own-
 ing large timber tracts in the coun-
 ty.

Three bootleggers have been
 convicted and sentenced to both
 heavy fines and imprisonment at
 the present term of circuit court at
 Roseburg. They are John Stan-
 cliff, W. D. Strange, Roseburg,
 and Frank Verrellman of Gard-
 nuer.

A large organized band of horse
 thieves has been operating over a
 large area of Central Oregon for
 several years past, says the Baker
 City Democrat. A favorite field
 for its operations is at Wagontire
 Mountain, the boundary line be-
 tween Crook and Harney counties,
 65 miles southwest of Burns and
 100 miles north of Lakeview,
 where there are at present 15,000
 horses.

SOUTHERN PACIFIC
FILES ITS REPORT

Salem, Oct. 19.—The annual re-
 port of the Southern Pacific com-
 pany was received at the railroad
 commission yesterday which shows
 that the net income of that cor-
 poration in Oregon for the year
 ending June 30, was \$2,971,393.67.
 The revenue for the company in
 Oregon is \$7,099,081.23. Ex-
 penses including taxes, \$4,127,-
 087.56. Taxes paid to the state of
 Oregon reach \$266,617.32.
 The total earnings of the S. P.
 for the year ending June 30 were
 \$21,066,550.83. Dividends de-
 clared, \$17,336,710.74. Seven per
 cent was declared on the preferred
 stock and six per cent on the com-
 mon.
