LANG CREEK WATER PROJECT PROGRESSING

of the proposed pipe line from Lang Creek to Cottage Grove. Engineer Roberts was then instructed to make a preliminary survey from the proposed intake on Lang Creek to the mouth of Junetta Creek 3 1/2 miles above and file his report with the city Recorder.

Engineer Roberts stated that it would be foolish to send men upon the Lang Creek water shed at this time of the year to map out the proposed Lang Creek water reserve. He suggested that a far more economical, and just as practical method of outlining this reserve at this time would be to secure the accurate maps of the forestry service, and outline the reserve from them, whereupon he was instructed to meet a forestry official in Supervisor Bartrum's office at Roseburg and proceed to outline this water reserve area and fix its boundaries.

Mayor Job suggested that a pipe line adequate to supply a city of 10,000 people would be large enough to adopt and said he did not favor the expense of an unnecessary large pipe. If the fall or grade is as great as reported, Engineer Roberts thought that a 12 inch pipe would have a capacity sufficient for supplying a city of from 10,000 to 15,000 people. However, a 14 inch pipe would only cost 20 per cent more than a 12 inch pipe and would carry 50 per cent more water. It is estimated that with a new reservoir built at an elevation of 200 feet above Cottage Grove there will still be a fall of 325 feet between Lang Creek and this reservoir.

Mr. Roberts stated that he expected to complete his preliminary survey and to be ready to report and submit his estimates to the council within 30 days.

He further stated that providing the bonds are floated without delay, the contract let for the pipe and work promptly, he could see no reason why Lang Creek water should not be given to this city by the time the dry season is upon us next year.

It is understood that the timber interests and the council will reach an amicable agreement and no obstacles will be placed in the way of the Lang Creek government timber sale and the proposed, big saw milling enterprise for this vicinity.
