cooped and in most of the classes
there was very strong competition
and the boys are well pleased with
their winnings in this show.

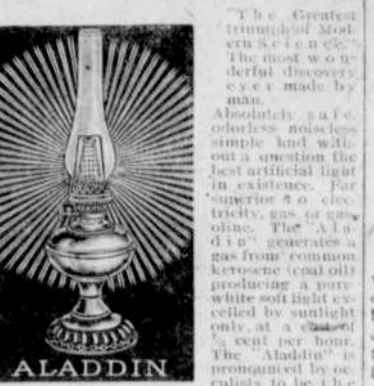
