### AIRSHIPS AT LOS ANGELES.

Aviation Camp, Los Angeles, Jan. 12.—Louis Paulhan, the French aviator, broke all official and unofficial records for altitude today in a Farman biplane. It is estimated he rose to the height of 4000 feet.

As methods of measurement are not exact, this may be questioned, but it is certain that he exceeded Hubert Latham's record made at Mourmelon, France, December 11, 1909, by at least 1000 feet. Latham's record was given at between 1600 and 1800 feet.

The instrument on Paulhan's machine made his greatest height 4600 feet. The judge's record of Paulhan's altitude, which has still to be sanctioned officially, was 1574 meters, approximately 5000 feet. The time in air was 50 minutes, 46 1-5 seconds. The time of descent was 7 minutes, 30 seconds.

Paulhan made his great record soon after losing the speed record of the course to Glenn H. Curtiss. Neither wind or rain seem to have any effect upon the airship flights at Los Angeles. Curtiss and Paulhan both continue to make new world records in spite of bad weather. The flying age is at hand.

LOUIS PAULHAN, FRENCH AVIATOR WHO IS COMING TO AMERICA.

Tempted by a large offer from an American syndicate, Louis Paulhan, the French aviator, has announced that he will come to the United States this winter for a series of flights. It was stated in Paris recently that Paulhan would receive something like \$125,000 as a guarantee for the trip. His plan is to give exhibitions in several of the large cities. His first flights probably will take place in California. Paulhan is one of the most daring of all the French aviators, and his machine differs in many respects from those of Bleriot and the Wright brothers. Paulhan is now at Los Angeles proving a strong competitor to Curtiss in making new world record flights.
