ASPARAGUS TO BE CANNED.

George A. Dorris, who supplies fancy asparagus to Portland and Seattle markets, which he grows exclusively on his irrigated farm near here, will, this spring, build a cannery to prepare the plant for Eastern markets, says a recent Springfield despatch to the Oregonian. His supply, which heretofore has been smaller than the demand, will be larger this year. The cannery will be operated by electricity, and he has arranged with the Eugene manager of the Northwestern Corporation which supplies lights and power for the two cities, to run a power line from the plant at Springfield to his farm, a distance of about a mile.

Mr. Dorris has studied the growing of this plant and is a second hand in the scientific way in which he has grown it until it is of an abnormal size and unusual quality. Very little of his crop is sold in local markets, most of it being shipped to Portland and other coast cities. The farm is situated on rich bottom land which overflows every year and is covered with rich sediment.
