C. M. Parker of Dexter, was looking after property interest here today. He owns the Leonard residence property on East Main street which may soon become business property.

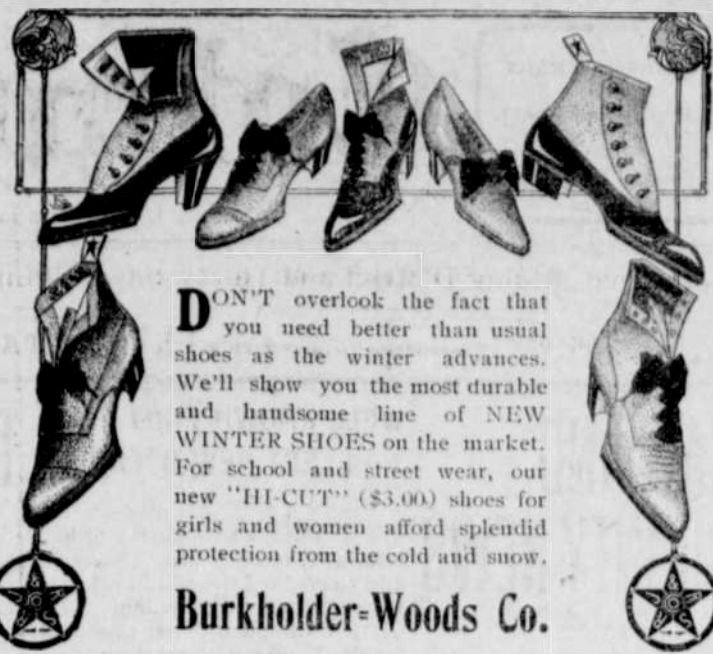
