SOMETHING ATTEMPTED SOMETHING DONE

Last Friday evening District Superintendent Abbott held the third quarterly conference of the Methodist church. The reports from the various departments showed growth in every department of the society. Forty additions to the membership had taken place. Seven transfers were given and one brother was translated making the net gain 32. The Sabbath school averaged 140 at its weekly sessions. Mrs. Mabel Chambers placed 14 new names on the cradle roll making a total of 66.

The Ladies Aid Society made 282 calls to the sick and 149 upon new comers. One hundred dollars had been earned. These women are responsible for the building of the large double porch and the painting of the parsonage. Never before has the attendance at the morning and evening services been as large as at the present time. A wonderful record is that of the Thursday services. Over 100 have been present a few times. Sixty seven is the high average for the quarter. Very often every attendant takes some part in the exercises. Both missionary societies, the league, the class meeting and the choir have much good work to their credit.

A strong sweet spirit of harmony exists between pastor and people and among the members themselves. There is every prospect that the remaining months of the conference year will be marked by continual prosperity.

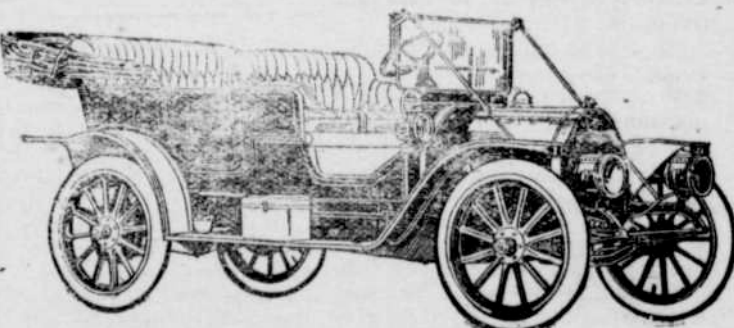
