Last year's exhibition, which was the first under the present organization, was more than pleasing to all, notwithstanding the handicap always to be overcome at the initial exhibition of an organization of this nature. But this season everything is being done to make the fair all it should be, and under the management of the competent men in charge everything points to a fair that would be a credit to any county in the state.

A glance over the premium book just issued by the directors shows a liberal list of prizes in every department. The purses for the racing features of the four days' entertainment are very generous and will no doubt bring many good horses to the meeting. The livestock, horticultural, agricultural, dairy and all other departments have been assigned plenty of time, space and prizes and the largest and best exhibits in the county's history will no doubt be in evidence.

Private H. T. Conner of this city will be one of the fifteen to represent the Oregon National Guard in the national rifle matches, which will be held at Camp Perry, Ohio.

Work of rebuilding the sawmill of J. H. Chambers, which was destroyed by fire a few weeks since is progressing rapidly, and it will probably be ready to saw by the middle of September. The capacity will be about 60,000 feet per day. The planing plant will also be completely rebuilt.

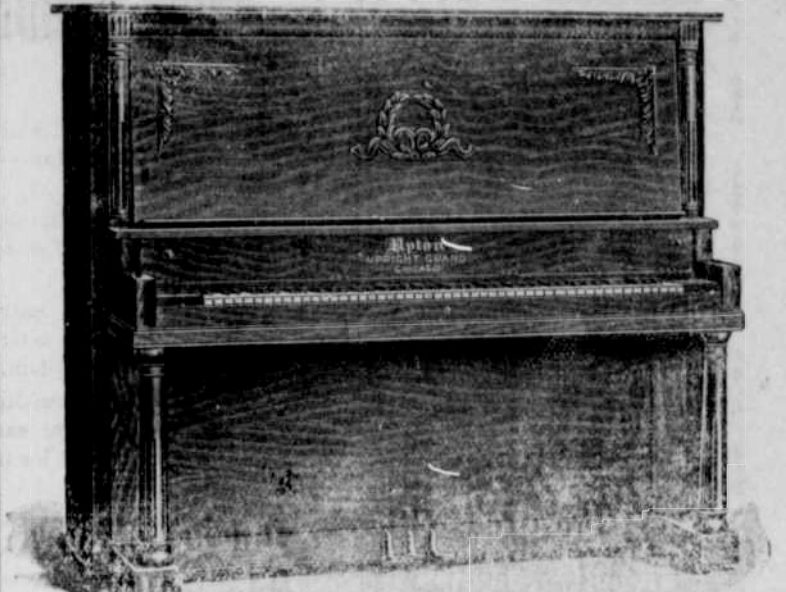

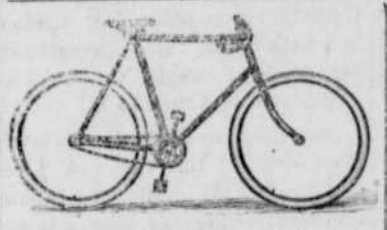
