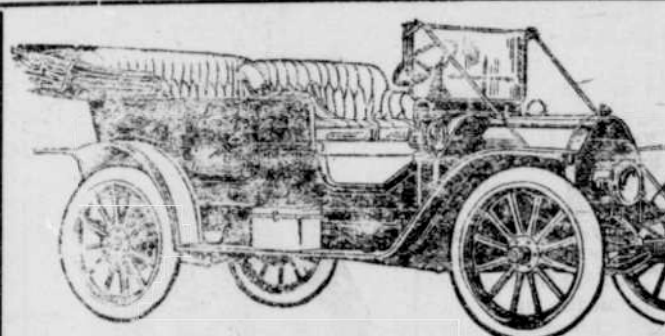


Engine Running Volume Pump
