### California Quake Losses Cost \$163,713,330; Paid.

Practically all of the insurance claims arising from the earthquake and fire in California in 1906 are now settled and the underwriters' reports today show a total of \$163,713,330 paid out. Within the last few days a number of satisfactions of judgments have been filed and the calendar is nearly clean.

Further efforts are being made, however, to force the welching companies to make additional payments. Several of the companies settled with some of their policyholders on a basis of 25 cents on the dollar, but have since paid 50 to 75 cents to others. The first victims of the welchers are now preparing to press their claims for larger payments and have organized among themselves to make concerted action.

### Palmer Offers Rogue River Ranch For Bird Reserve.

Medford, Ore., Aug. 19th.—In order that "bob whites" may be raised in southern Oregon, to kill off any pests that may invade the valley and prevent others, Monroe Palmer, the Chicago millionaire, will give his 3000-acre ranch on Rogue river, near Bybee bridge, to the state of Oregon for a game preserve.

When William L. Finley was in Medford last month, one of his most enthusiastic friends was Mr. Palmer and he took up immediately the suggestion of the master game warden that a game preserve be established near here. If the state accepts the offer and the ranch is stocked with the gamey bird, the Rogue river country will become a favorite haunt of hunters as well as fishermen.

### MORE R. R. RUMORS REACH COOS BAY

The Coos Bay Times says: A number of railroad rumors are afloat on the Bay and if credence can be placed in the gossip, which is apparently better founded than the usual line of "dope," Coos Bay will have at least one and possibly two other railroads besides the Southern Pacific's line from Eugene.

One story afloat today is that a large railroad contractor has been here figuring on the Coos Bay and Boise project, indicating that actual construction is to start soon on it. President Francis H. Clark is in Marshfield but is making no statement. He stated yesterday that his company's policy would be the same as it has been in the past, to let real work or developments speak for themselves.

### ANOTHER HILL STORY.

According to a report current here today, Minneapolis advices are that the Minneapolis Tribune quotes Jas. J. Hill system, in an interview as stating:

"If the Harriman people beat us to Coos Bay they will have to go some."

The statement is said to have been made by Mr. Hill when asked for an expression on the announcement of General Manager O'Brien that the Southern Pacific was going to build from Eugene to Coos Bay.

### Would Lighten Taxes on Improvements

Assessor Dodge, of San Francisco, says: "All communities that have modified the antiquated general property tax have inclined toward lightening taxes on improvements which necessarily must tend to lay a heavier tax on land. Land which is improved, while it might be heavier taxed, would be relieved by the exemption of the building which stood upon it from taxation. The land which was unimproved, however, would bear the brunt of the increased tax. This is the land which is generally held for the unearned increment, and frequently held by non-residents, and usually by persons of large means, for purely speculative purposes."

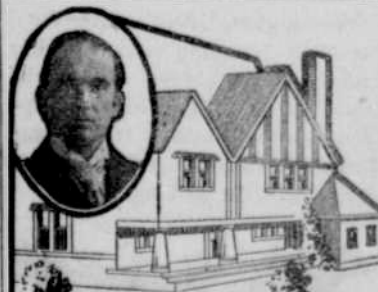

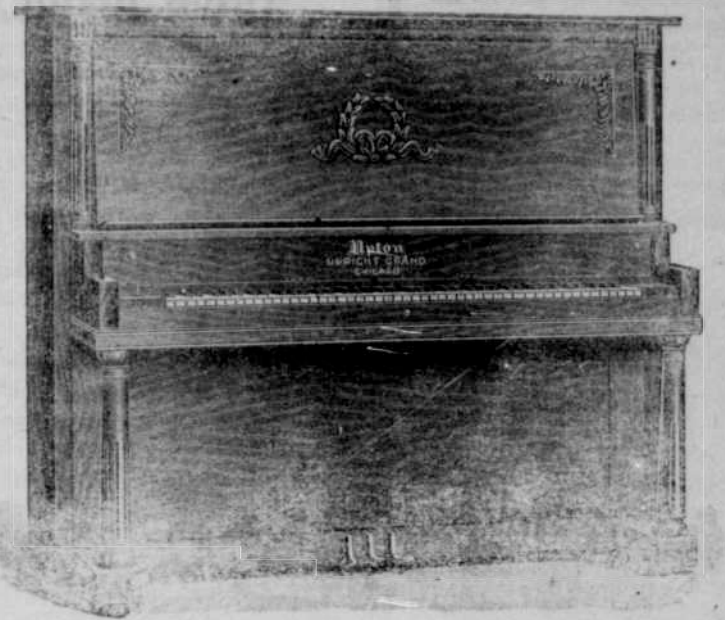
