

**BARNES' MONSTER SHOWS
WILL EXHIBIT HERE OCT. 6**

The Barnes Show is the only real wild animal circus on earth and requires a train of 20 railway cars, sixty and seventy feet in length, especially constructed for Mr. Barnes to transport the monster collection of wild animals, horses, ponies, paraphernalia and the army of people employed with the show. Over 300 marvelously trained jungle and forest bred animals are included in the collection. Every animal represented in the Garden of Eden has a descendant in the Al. G. Barnes' Big 3 Ring Wild Animal Circus. There is a lion that rides a horse, also bears, monkeys, dogs and goats that give exhibition of horsemanship, riding ponies dashing around the ring; seals that juggle balls, batons and lighted torches on horse-back; elephants that act as barbers, operate a laundry, stand on their heads, play musical instruments, and perform a score of tricks; ponies that drill, waltz, cakewalk, add, multiply and tell the time of day; bears that juggle, turn somersaults, and imitate drunken men and other funny antics.

The tiger is the most ferocious of all the wild beasts and is the only animal that kills for the pure delight of killing. In the massive steel arenas which are put up in the three rings, appear performing groups of lions, a mixed group of pumas, leopards and jaguars, all having a natural antipathy to each other, held under complete control by the trainer. There is an outlaw, man-killing, untamable full grown, jungle bred African male lion that has killed three trainers, who have attempted to break him. There are performing goats that, with the clown, give imitations of Mexican bull-fights; there are funny donkeys; seals that present a band concert, playing on brass instruments, beating drums etc.

"Monkeyland" is the name given to a collection of apes, monkeys, chimpanzees, baboons and gorillas; being the largest collection of members of the Darwinian family ever gathered together. There are several other attractions of equal merit, but which would require too much space to enumerate.

SIGNBOARDS FROM VANCOUVER TO CALIFORNIA

It is now possible for the motorist to drive from Vancouver, B. C. to the California border with no other guide than the big white signs of Pacific Highway. The crew which set out from the shores of the Columbia river, Sept. 8, arrived at the California line Wednesday, Sept. 20, their trail well-marked with the signs at every cross-roads from Portland to Coleston. Even better time would have been made had it not been for exceptionally heavy weather during the first part of the trip.

The whole state is enthusiastic over the Pacific Highway project. At every town along their route the road marking party was met by delegations from the influential bodies of the community, such as the Commercial Club, Automobile Club, etc. Pacific Highway is undoubtedly the most popular project of its kind that has ever attracted the attention of the State of Oregon.

The journey of the crew, the replete with much hard work, was a kin of perpetual triumph. The largest city, as well as the smallest village, was glad to meet Pacific Highway, and welcomed it and its builders with warmest hospitality. At Portland, Mayor Rushlight himself planted the first post; and it was the same story all along. The Highway Association has the figurative key of every community along its route.

The party was headed by F. M. Fretwell, Secretary of the Association who was aided by M. K. McRae, J. V. Connell and A. V. House, of Portland. Two men were taken along to dig post-holes. A five-ton truck was lent by the Landy Auto Company, of Portland, while the Studebaker, E-M-F branch of that city donated the services of a Flanders "20" touring car. A large amount of necessary

equipment was carried besides the big load of posts and signs.

The Capital Highway route was recently planted by the State Highway Commission, to run on the eastern side of the Willamette river, although Pacific Highway has been marked on the west side, there is a possibility that it may be moved over. "The west side road" was chosen because it is now in good condition and because of its scenic advantages" said Frank Branch Riley, vice-president for Oregon, recently. "If the proposed east side road is shown to be a better one there is no reason why a change cannot be made."

That Pacific Highway will be marked through California by next summer is the prediction of leading members of the Association.

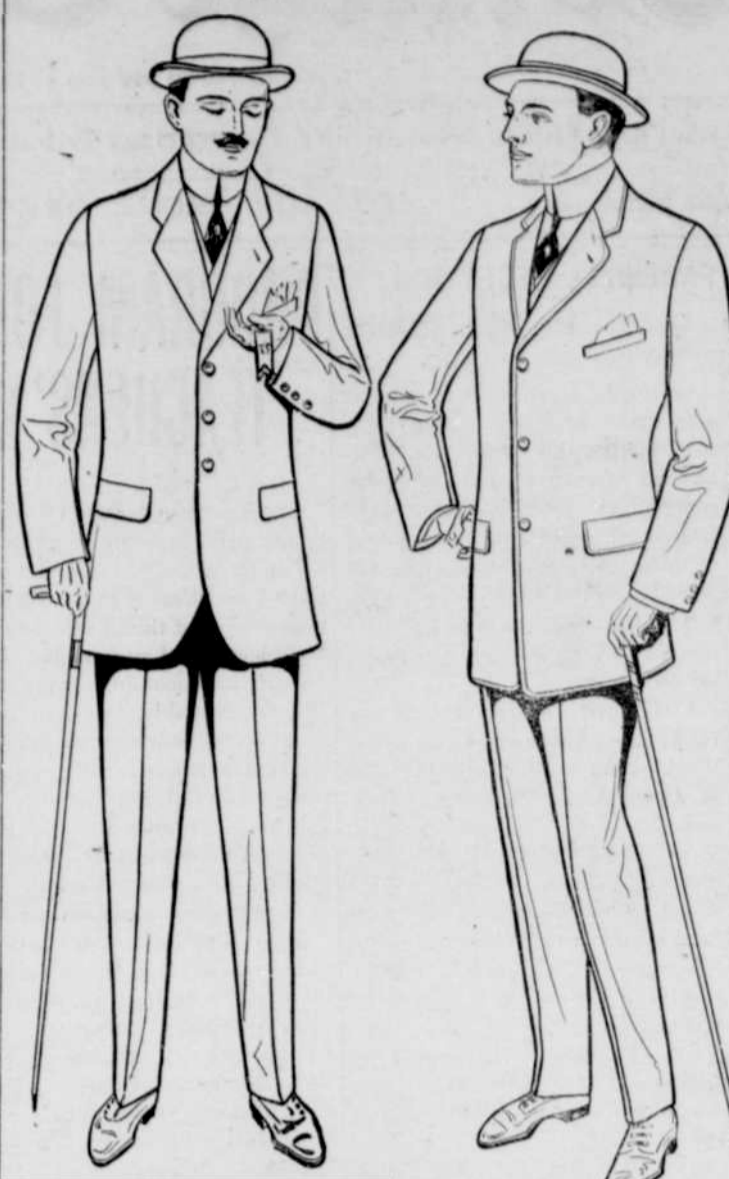

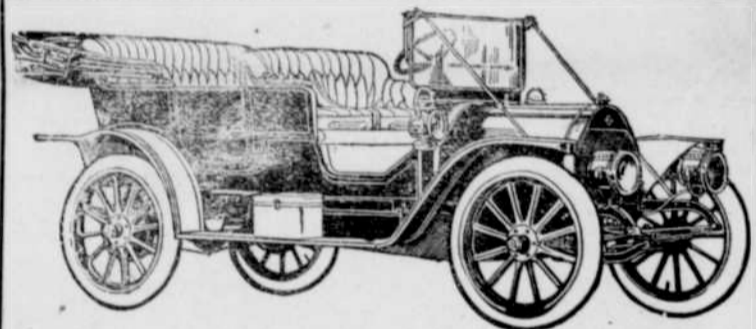

O. A. C. NOTES

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Ore. Sept. 21. That the annual live stock production of the state is worth \$91,689,400 was stated by Dr. James Withycombe, director of the experiment station at the State Agricultural College, in an address at the annual banquet of the Oregon Pure Bred Live Stock Association at the state fair.

His statistics were as follows: 673, 750 cattle valued at \$13,475,000; 175,000 dairy cows at \$7,000,000 295,000 horses at \$432,538,000; 8,670 mules at \$1,040,400; 2,401,000 sheep at \$9,604,000; 324,000 hogs at \$3,888,000; 220,000 goats at \$880,000; 20,000,000 lbs of wool at \$4,000,000 880,000 lbs. of mohair at \$264,000; dairy products at \$14,000,000; and poultry at \$5,000,000, making a total value of \$91,689,400.

C. L. Hawley of the college board of regents was re-elected president at the annual meeting, and M. C. Marris was made secretary. The meeting was addressed by Prof. Carlyle of Idaho, Prof. Van Pelt Iowa, and Pres. W. J. Kerr of O. A. C. Pres. Kerr spoke on the advantages of agricultural education, the necessity of getting the boys interested in farming early, and other farm problems.
