**CHURCH NOTES**

The workers of the Methodist church are exceedingly gratified with two records they made during the month of November. There was an average attendance at prayer meeting of seventy and one hundred and sixty-one at Sabbath school. The coming Lord's day evening will be especially interesting. Lecture by Robert Sutcliffe on "Wendell Phillips the great Abolitionist Orator" or "A Boy's Consecration" every worker for a better day will find it to his advantage to be present. From 8:30 to 9:30 Mr. and Mrs. Sutcliffe will give a "Sing Around the Piano". This is an entirely new feature of church work.
