Many Soldiers to Maneuver in Oregon

San Francisco, Jan. 16.—The largest army ever concentrated by this government in time of peace will be assembled on the Pacific coast during the summer months. According to the report given out in army circles and confirmed by dispatches to this city from Washington, it is planned by the war department to order more than 27,000 soldiers into the fields in full fighting equipment. This will include all the regular and militia regiments of the Pacific coast states—Oregon, Washington, California, Arizona, New Mexico and Utah. Cavalry, infantry, artillery, signal corps and hospital corps will be the different branches of the service which will participate.

It is stated that these huge maneuvers will be held the latter part of June or the first part of July. The grounds selected for the mimic battles will be in and around Klamath Falls, Or.

What purposes the government had for the mobilization of such a large body of troops the local army officers state they do not know, but it has been known for some time that the war department has been desirous of making a show of force on the Pacific coast similar to that which was made the last summer along the Mexican border.

Big Real Estate Deal

The Eugene Guard of the 15th

One of the largest deals in Eugene realty circles was consummated this morning, when a syndicate composed of P. E. Snodgrass, F. L. Chambers and other of their friends purchased, through the Jack Rodman company, a 1500-acre farm, situated 3 1/2 miles south of Eugene and owned by S. H. Graham, of Portland. While the consideration is not given, it is generally supposed to be \$40,000 cash or over.

The purpose of this company will be to immediately plat this farm into 40-acre tracts and place them on the market at a less price than any close in acreage on the Eugene market today. This will be handled by the Rodman company.

To Promote Racing.

San Francisco, Jan. 18.—The Pacific Coast Fair and Racing Association, an organization to promote trotting and races, Horsemen from all parts of the coast, Phoenix and Salt Lake were present. Plans were laid for a series of purse exhibitions, the most important of which will be a breeders' futurity between September 23 and September 28, probably at Sacramento. The officers elected were: I. L. Borden, San Francisco, president; Frank B. Alley, Roseburg, Or., vice-president; T. J. Crowley, San Francisco, treasurer; Shirley Christie, Phoenix, secretary. Among the directors are J. H. Booth, Roseburg, and G. A. Westgate, Salem.

Oregon Asked for Aid

H. E. Wahlberg, of Lents, who graduated from the Oregon Agricultural College last June after specializing in horticulture, has just been made superintendent of 65 acres of eight year old apple trees near Victorville, Calif., one of the few apple orchards in the citrus belt.

Georgia growers have recently sent to O. A. C. for three men to manage fruit farms, but it has been impossible to comply with the requests, since the demand from Oregon and adjacent states takes all of the graduates who do not own orchards and farms of their own.
