We obtained the paper through the kindness of our townsman, Edgar King, our attention being called to it by Uncle Burn Veatch, the latter of whom knew her as long ago as he can remember, but whom he has not seen for over sixty years.

The sketch reads as follows: White county's oldest citizen, Mrs. Betsy Storey, recently celebrated her 99th birthday. She is in good health and will likely pass the century mark—Golconda Herald.

To the writer, the above paragraph seems like a dream—oh how well do we yet remember Uncle George Storey and the pack of hounds.

How well do we remember the deer drive in the open daylight when the neighbors gathered in and Uncle George mounted on horseback, armed with a long rifle or a revolutionary musket and a long horn off a slaughtered ox or of precious tin led the chase—in those days Uncle Elias Jordan was a famous shot and he was generally placed "on the stand"—that is where the deer crossed so as to be more sure of venison steaks for the party—the sound of that horn, the baying of those dogs and the report of the trusty musket thrills one yet. Few there be now and far apart are those who remember those things. Those were the days when Uncle George's and Aunt Betsy's children, along with that redheaded Trousdale boy went to school to Daniel McCarthy, maybe Millage Miller, Aleck Trousdale of Preston Orr at the old log school were Wesley Chapel now stands.

Then the wild deer were chased away from the corn shucks when the starlit night fell over forest and field, or maybe Uncle George followed the hounds when the nights were fine as they chased the foxes from Seven Mile prairie to Diney Ridge—then Bol Stillman kept store, while Frank Willis or Aleck Trousdale counted out the eggs, weighed the sugar or measured out the New Orleans molasses.

Then wild turkeys by dozens and dozens came into the farmer's cornfield when the food in the woods grew scarce.

Aunt Betsy, send you the homage of a heart that yet melts in sweet remembrances of those far-away days; may the glow of the evening's sunlight of life, cheer and warm your dear old heart is the fervent prayer of one who holds in sweet remembrance the friends of his early days.
