Harbor Improvements

Washington, Jan. 24.—Some of the projects for which appropriations are asked at this session of congress are:

Improvement of Willamette river between Portland, Oregon City and Harrisburg by dredging a six-foot low water channel 150 to 200 feet wide below and 100 feet wide above the head of Clackamas Rapids, the removal of Copley's Rock, and the improvement of the river to Harrisburg to a low water depth of 3½ feet—\$40,000, with \$2500 for annual maintenance. It is estimated that with a six-foot depth at low water, the amount of freight that could be carried annually between Portland and Oregon City, in the paper industry alone, would be worth \$7,833,000.

Improvements of Tillamook bar and bay, \$206,000 to be raised by the Port of Tillamook, the Port of Bay City and the Port of Bayocean. Improvement and maintenance of Siuslaw river, \$5000. Improvement and maintenance of Coos river, \$3,000. Improvement and maintenance of Clatskanie river, \$1,000. Maintenance of Coos Bay, \$10,000.

Because the reports on Yaquina river and Nehalem bar had not been officially passed upon by the board of engineers the claims of these two projects were presented, the amounts to be stated later.

Representative Hawley presented to the house committee the following list of western Oregon port commissions, authorized under the Oregon law for the purpose of levying taxes to be used in co-operation with the government in river and harbor improvement:

On the Coquille river, one already formed, another forming. On Coos Bay, the Port of Coos Bay. On the Siuslaw river, the Port of Siuslaw. On the Tillamook Bay, the Port of Tillamook, Port of Bay City and Port of Bayocean. On the Nehalem Bay, the Port of Nehalem. On the Willamette river, the Port of Portland and the state of Oregon. On the Yaquina river, one port already organized and another contemplated.

Co-operative tests in wood preservation, especially as to fence posts, are being carried on by H. B. Oakleaf of the U. S. Forest Service office of products at Portland and the school of forestry at the Oregon Agricultural College. In preserving fence posts, the hot and cold tank method, of forcing hot creosote for three hours into the wood, and then immersing it for the same length of time in cold creosote, is used. Both oak and fir posts were used, and it has already been fairly determined that posts thus treated will outlast ordinary posts by many years.

Portland, Or. Jan. 23 (Special)—A permanent state organization that will have considerable influence on Oregon affairs is promised through the formation of the Oregon Irrigation Congress, which has been called for February 19, 20 and 21 in the convention hall of the Portland Commercial Club. All interested in irrigation are urged to attend and suggestions will be welcomed. The purpose of the congress is to have an effective organization to deal with irrigation questions and to secure the rights Oregon feels itself entitled to from the Federal Government.

Indications are that there will be a big attendance from all parts of the state. Government officials and irrigation experts from all parts of the state will be invited and the proposed organization promises to make itself very useful to Oregon in the work of future development.
