PACIFIC HIGHWAY IS PROGRESSING

At a meeting of the Executive
Board of the Pacific Highway,
held in Seattle April 6th, definite
plans were adopted for immediate
marking of Pacific Highway from
the Oregon-California boundary to
the city of Redding at the head of
the Sacramento valley. This is
only a comparatively short stretch
of road, the distance being con-
siderably less than two hundred
miles, but at the present time no
signs at all of any kind direct the
tourist who may happen to be pass-
ing through the country. Then
too some of the worst road on the
Pacific Highway route is in this
northern California stretch.

This sign-posting work will be
done under the personal direction
of Frank M. Fretwell, Secretary
of the Association, and the Cali-
fornia State Automobile Associa-
tion have agreed to share a part of
the financial burden of carrying
out this work.

When this link is connected up
with road-markers the familiar
Pacific Highway signs mark the
road of three nations, from Van-
couver, B. C. to Redding.

From Redding to San Diego
signs of the California State Auto-
mobile Association and the Auto-
mobile Club of Southern California
are very much in evidence. It is
not difficult for trade of all kinds
to easily find its way through the
country.

The work of signing the Pacific
Highway from San Diego to Yuma
was authorized at the Seattle meet-
ing, details of which, however,
were not entirely worked out. It
is expected that this work will be
done about the same time that the
northern California marking is un-
dertaken.

One of the most gratifying
things that came to the notice of
the Executive Committee of the
Pacific Highway Association was
the splendid cooperation that was
in evidence by County Commis-
sioners and other local authorities
through which this International
Boulevard passes. This is espe-
cially true of the County Road of-
ficials in the state of Washington.
Practically every locality in the
Evergreen State is now at work
improving their section of the
Pacific Highway. With this kind
of community cooperation the mat-
ter of making a perfect Pacific
Highway will only be a question
of a short time.

Elder Tree Makes Enormous Growth.

It is a well known fact that
western Oregon is widely reputed
as being a very prolific section,
and particularly so when tree
growth is taken into consideration.
And while we do not claim for it
as large trees as the giant red-
woods of California, our red cedars
and firs grow to enormous size and
height, but one of the oddest spec-
imens which has come under our
observation during our thirty-one
years' residence on the Pacific
coast was shown us last week by
J. W. Gowdy who resides near the
Cottage Grove Flouring Mill.
This is an elder tree which Mr.
Gowdy has watched make this
enormous growth during his long
residence in Cottage Grove. The
tree stands in his door yard, and
has furnished the fruit for many
an elder-berry pie which he and
his family have enjoyed. At a
glance one might mistake the tree
for a respectable sized maple, at a
time when there were no leaves on
its branches, it being of about the
proportions of a tree of that sort.
By actual and honest measurement
some three or four feet from the
ground it gives a circumference of
seven feet, four feet from the

inches.

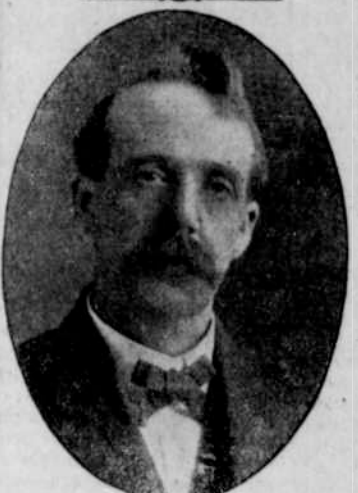
