WILL COMPLETE
McKENZIE ROAD

In seeking a new and more prac-
ticable route for a road from Lost
Creek to the summit of the Cas-
cades, the county court is undoubt-
edly making a move that will re-
sult in much good to Eugene and
Lane county. If a good road is
located and built, it will be the
means of bringing through this sec-
tion an immense tourist travel that
now goes elsewhere.

Roads across the Cascades that
can be traveled by automobiles are
as scarce as snowballs in the Sa-
hara desert. Most of the travelers
who wish to go from Western into
Eastern Oregon are now compelled
to ship their cars up the Columbia
river to The Dalles, and go from
there down the east side of the
mountains. This means an un-
pleasant interruption of the trip in
addition to considerable expense.

The McKenzie is one of the few
passes that are feasible for a wagon
road. Except for ten or fifteen
miles of steep grades, the road is
already in very good condition.
The road across the lava beds at
the summit is in splendid condition.
The lava rock has been crushed
and spread, and the surface is as
smooth as macadam. The road
down the eastern slope of the
mountains is good, and hundreds
of machines already make the trip
up the west side as far as McKenzie
Bridge.

Improving the present impass-
able stretch of road will make the
McKenzie the favored route for
automobilists wishing to cross into
Eastern Oregon. Automobile tour-
ist travel is highly desirable. It
means that much money will be
spent in this section that would not
otherwise come.—Register.

Safe Ocean Travel.

From information received from
the Southern Pacific Company,
operating the Steamship Line be-
tween New York and New Orleans,
we learn that passengers using that
line need have no fear in case of
accident. The life-boat capacity
of these ships has always been suf-
ficient to accommodate all of the pas-
sengers and crew, and the wireless
equipment is such that the wireless
room at all times, night and day,
is in charge of an experienced op-
erator. Notices are posted in all
staterooms, public rooms and steer-
age, showing the assignments of
occupants to special boats, and all
life-boats are conspicuously num-
bered. Fire and boat drills are
held at each port as well as on the
first day out and passengers are
invited to take part in them. Stew-
ards demonstrate how to attach
life-belts to the body. It is said
that these are not new rulings, but
have been in force on these ships
for several years.
