Rigid, But Sensible

Once more Judge McGinn of the circuit bench is going to do the usual thing, and all in the interest of expedition in the administration of the law, or more correctly in the conduct of court procedure. Ten minutes to a man is the dictum with reference to examining jurors. Judge McGinn figures that any lawyer shrewd enough to try a case in his court ought to be able to find out in that time whether he wants a talesman or whether he does not. As that is pretty much all there is to the selection of jurors so far as the lawyers can make it go, and as the lawyers and the court and the jury seem generally so to understand the situation, the public bows its acquiescence and gently murmurs: "that's common sense."

Naturally there will be a roar of protest from the lawyers—from most of them at least and perhaps all of them. Because the lawyer is a great fellow for tradition and precedent, however obstructive and ridiculous the tradition or precedent may be. But the judge is a man of pretty starchy vertebra. He probably knows what he has a right to insist upon, and the chances are that in his court at any rate the selection of juries will go on more speedily if not more smoothly than it has done previously. The net result will be the saving of some thousands of dollars to the country in the county in the course of the year, if nothing more.—Evening Telegram.

Correspondence School Feature of University.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Ore., June 14.—With an enrollment of 356 for the school year just closing, the Correspondence Department of the University of Oregon is becoming one of the big features of the institution's work. With thirty-five courses offered and thirty instructors giving a share of their time to the correction of papers and the offering of suggestions, a chance for study at home is offered to every resident of the state at the expense of the postage stamps, with which the work is carried on.

The correspondence school was first organized in 1907. Its growth and advancement since then has been due greatly to the efforts of Dr. H. B. Leonard, the dean of the department. The correspondence courses are especially intended for teachers, students preparing for college, women's clubs, granges, home makers, and engineers. There are no entrance requirements, the only demand being that of ability to do the work.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Or., June 14.—The filter plant installed a year ago last January by the city of Eugene at the suggestion of Professor Stafford, head of the department of biology at the University of Oregon, has proven an absolute success. The Tri-weekly tests which have been made by Professor Sweetzer of the department of botany, have showed con-

tinued purity and freedom from intestinal bacteria throughout the present school year. The most satisfactory proof of the thoroughness of the filter plant is the fact that there has not been a single case of typhoid fever among the students of the University since filtration of the water began.
