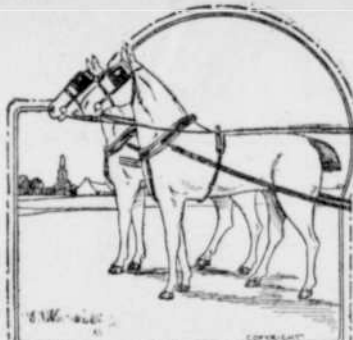

SHOULD VOTE

"Judge" lately offered a prize

for the best ten reasons why

women should vote. Fifteen hun-

dred replies were received from

every corner of the globe. The

following reasons won the first

prize.

1. They are citizens, and there-

fore, are entitled to a voice in

making the laws by which they

are governed.

2. They are taxpayers, forced

to help support the machinery of

government. History upholds their

contention that "taxation without

representation is tyranny."

3. They are home-makers, and

need the ballot to protect the home

from adulterated foods, diseased

meats and germinifed clothing.

4. They are mothers, and there-

fore, fitted by nature to set the

standard by which the public shall

treat children. To make their

child-welfare work effective they

must have the ballot.

5. They are wives, and realize

the necessity for social purity.

They need the ballot to help elect

candidates who favor strict vice

regulations.

6. They are sweethearts, and

interest in their future home

prompts the desire to aid actively

in securing fair wages, decent

working conditions and an eight

hour law for men.

7. They are daughters, and

rightfully mindful of their parents'

welfare. They need the ballot to

swell the ranks of the humani-

tarians who will vote for old-age

pensions.

8. They are women, and for

centuries have been condemned by

convention to confine their activi-

ties within the walls of home.

They need the broadening influence

of active interest in local, state

and national affairs.

9. They are workers, and have

entered the industrial world to stay.

They therefore need the ballot to

protect themselves.

10. Actual experience in the

equal suffrage states has proven

the stock arguments against wo-

man suffrage to be groundless,

for women have not lost their

womanliness nor their love of

home and family, while they have

shown their fitness to vote for the

best interests of humanity.

Construction to Begin on Coast Line.

North Bend, Ore., June 21.—Im-

mediate preparation for the con-

struction of the Southern Pacific

line from Eugene to Coos Bay will

be made by representatives of Mc-

Arthur, Perks & Company, which

has the contract. General Super-

intendent Tinkler will arrive next

week and Thomas Dixon, who is

head man in the absence of Mr.

Tinkler, arrived today on the

steamer Washington from San

Francisco, together with George H.

Cool, of the financial department

of the company. It is announced

by the representative of the com-

pany that he will take up his resi-

dence in this city and will open

offices.

Much of the machinery to be

used at this end of the line is in

Arizona and the moving of the

equipment to this point will begin

soon. It is estimated that it will

be the middle or latter part of July

before work can be started. Mr.

Dixon says he will be able to an-

nounce plans within a few days.

Assurance is given that there will

be no further delay in the starting

of construction.

MEAT SHIPMENT

The biggest single shipment of

packing house products for an

Alaska customer ever made left

Portland recently by special train

for Tacoma where it will be put

aboard a refrigerator vessel and re-

shipped north. The shipment

amounted to 400,000 pounds of

frozen meats valued at over \$50,-

000. The meat will be kept frozen

until used. Heretofore, such big

shipments have been supplied by

eastern packers but Oregon is now

able to fill these orders.

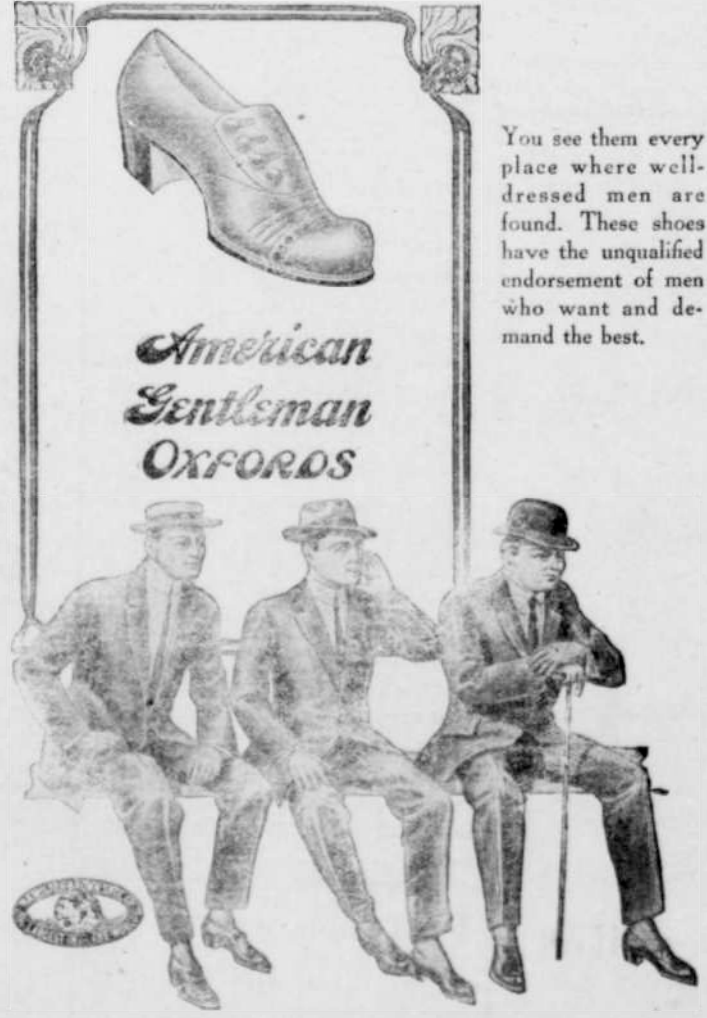

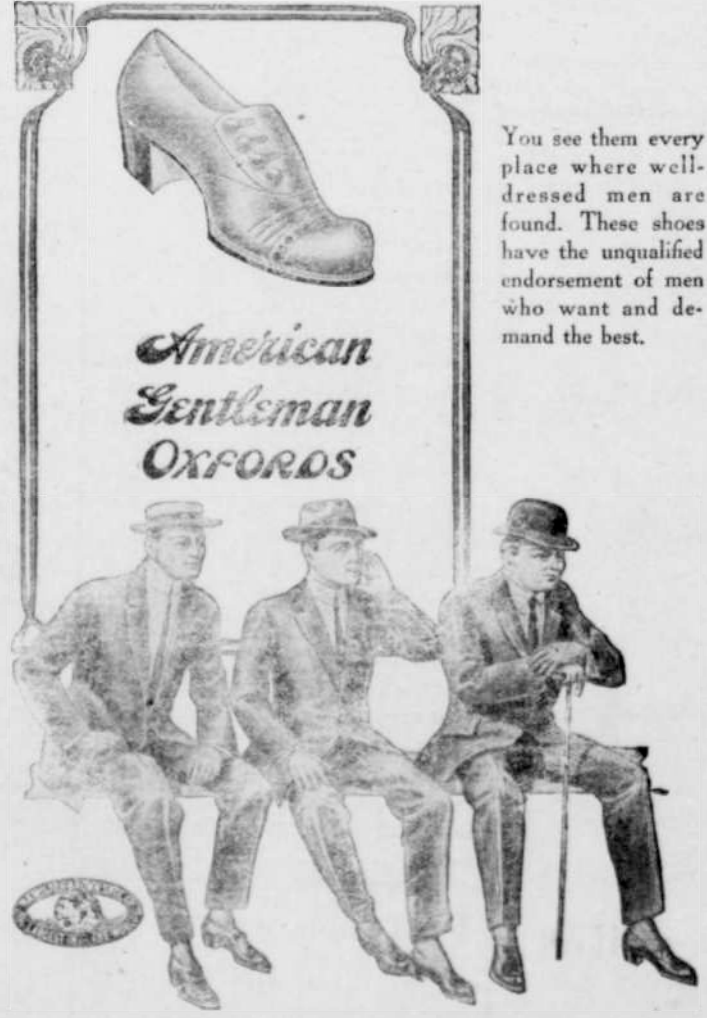
