

## A QUESTION OF BOOSTING

### Figures Won't Lie

Why do people emigrate from one country or state to another? Why are new countries settled, and why one section faster than another? Why does one town grow faster than another with equal chances and inducements to offer to the settler?

The booster will tell you that, everything else being equal, the town and country whose citizens boost, will outstrip the dead ones, and the booster has the right solution.

Do the figures prove that the people of Oregon are too conservative? Let us see!

The best way to answer the question is by comparing Oregon and Oregon's growth and development with a neighboring state and a neighboring state's advancement and growth.

Oregon has 94,500 square miles of land, while Washington has but 66,880 square miles.

Oregon was made a state in February, 1859, Washington did not become a state until November, 1889—more than thirty years later.

In 1870 Oregon had 174,786 people, while Washington had but 75,116. In 1890 Oregon had a population of 313,767; at that time Washington had 349,390. Ten years later Oregon had 413,536, while Washington had 518,103 people, and in 1910 Oregon only had 672,768, while Washington's population had increased to 1,141,990, making a growth of 48.3 per cent from 1890 to 1900 and from 1900 to 1910 an increase of 120.4 per cent, while Oregon was increasing 31.8 and 62.7 per cent respectively.

In 1900 the average population per square mile in Oregon was 4.4, while Washington had 7.7. In 1910 Oregon's population was 7 per square mile, while Washington had 17.1.

In 1890 Oregon's chief city had a population of 46,385, while Washington's big town only had 42,837. In 1910 Portland had grown to 207,214, while the Washington metropolis had 273,193 people.

From 1900 to 1910, while Oregon was increasing 259,220 in population, Washington added 623,817.

Oregon had in 1910 one city of over 100,000; one more of over 10,000; five more with over 5,000 each; eight more with over 3,000; thirty-two more with over 1,000, and 289 towns and cities with a population of over 100 each.

At the last census Washington had two cities with over 100,000 population, and one with over 75,000; two with over 20,000; one with over 15,000; two with over 10,000; four with over 5,000; 11 with over 3,000; forty-nine with over 1,000, and 471 cities and towns with more than 100 population.

Oregon had thirty years the start of Washington. Oregon has more land, as good soil, as fine a climate, as much timber, as much mineral, as much of everything necessary to the health, happiness and prosperity of a great population as her neighboring state, and yet that state is outgrowing Oregon at a rate of more than 5.6 per cent every year.

These figures do not lie, and there must be a reason for this difference in the advancement of two states, where, if there be any difference, the advantage is with the Beaver State.

Who on the Pacific Coast has not heard of the "Seattle Spirit?" It is a spirit of "Get Together, Stay Together, Work Together." It is a spirit of pride in home—the home town, the home county, the home state—the real, simon pure patriotism.

It is a spirit that boosts through seasons of dull business and cloudy skies, just as hard or a little harder than when the sun is shining. It is the spirit that goes out and gets; that overcomes obstacles; that does not hesitate to spend all of the profits of today to build bigger and better tomorrow. It is enthusiasm concentrated, boiled down, double-distilled. And it will win over the caution of conservatism seven days in the week and fifty-two weeks in the year.

Oregon is accused of being too conservative in the matter of going out after the thing she needs most to make her a great and grand commonwealth—a large, intelligent, progressive population, and somehow the figures convict her.

### CLEAN THE GARBAGE CANS.

**G**ARBAGE cans should receive your attention now. See that the next cleaning is thorough, that all matter is removed from the corners and that none is permitted to remain on the ground. A good flushing of the can with a carbolic acid solution—three tablespoonfuls of 95 per cent carbolic acid to each quart of water, permitting the excess to remain in the can—will not only destroy any remaining fly life, in egg or maggot form, but will also serve to act as a fly repellent until the next cleaning, which should be within a few days. Smaller garbage cans in use at your back door should receive daily attention with carbolic acid solution.

### TREAT HOUSE FLY LIKE DEVIL.

**S**CREEN your windows! If you cannot get wire screening use mosquito bar. Screen your doors! Keep out the fly as you would keep out the devil, for he is a devil. Swat those flies that are not eliminated by the starvation process. Keep a fly swatter for every room in the house. Cease your game to kill the fly. Stop conversation with your company and chase that fly. Swat! Never mind knocking over the vase or upsetting the lamp. Swat! This is no time for mercy or gentleness. The land is invaded. Our enemies are upon us. The black typhoid fever brigade advances. Kill, entrap, burn, starve. Spare not.

### Cleanliness Kills Flies.

**H**OW do flies live through the winter? A few lazy, lazy flies can be found half dead, but still living, around chimneys and warm places in the house or stable. They will come to life just as soon as the boys begin playing marbles.

If no garbage or filth were to be found the female flies would die and the stock might be lost.

We must keep things clean to keep flies from breeding. When they have come we can catch them with fly paper or fly traps or kill them with fly poison. We can keep them out of the house by keeping the windows and doors screened.

They crawl into the sugar, the milk and the bread. They have just been crawling into other places. They get typhoid germs and give you typhoid. They get consumption and spread it.

### SWAT THE FLY

#### Where Disease Lurks.

**T**HE fly has long, feathery antennae used in gathering minute particles of food. In these and the stiff hairs on the body lurk the disease germs that the house fly spreads everywhere he goes.

### Some Things to Be Remembered In Fighting the Fly.

**K**EEP the flies away from the sick, especially those ill with contagious diseases. Kill every fly that strays into the sickroom. His body is covered with disease germs.

Do not allow decaying material of any sort to accumulate on or near your premises.

All refuse which tends in any way to fermentation, such as bedding straw, paper waste and vegetable matter, should be disposed of or covered with lime or kerosene oil.

Screen all food, especially milk. Keep all receptacles for garbage carefully covered and the cans cleaned or sprinkled with oil or lime.

See that your sewage system is in good order; that it does not leak, is up to date and not exposed to flies. Pour kerosene oil into drains. Cover food after a meal.

Screen all food exposed for sale. Screen all windows and doors, especially the kitchen and dining room. Burn pyrethrum powder in the house to kill the flies.

Don't forget if you see flies their breeding place is in nearby filth. It may be behind the door, under the table or in the cuspidor.

If there is no dirt or filth there will be no flies.

If there is a nuisance in the neighborhood write at once to the health department.
