



News Snapshots Of the Week

Fears of raids by Zeppelin airships were expressed in England, and hundreds of aeroplanes were kept in readiness to repel an attack and to furnish news of immediate danger. Hundreds of wounded British soldiers were returned to England for treatment. The fighting along the river Oise continued, and many bridges were blown up to hinder the movements of the enemy. German artillery captured in France was taken to England to be exhibited as proof of the success of the allies. The converted cruiser Caronia, on which guns have been mounted, hovered around the port of New York searching outgoing steamers for Germans and contraband goods. Shipping men protested at such action as causing expensive delays. Managers George Stallings and Connie Mack lined their teams up in Philadelphia to begin the battles for the world's baseball championship. M. Turpin's deadly turpentine shells were used by France.

opportunities and did become familiar with all the departments of business of the county, and from that knowledge so gained I believe I can give a fair, just and economical administration of the affairs of the county, and if elected county judge I promise you my best endeavors to do so and to see that you get value received for every dollar spent, and that every part of the country has equal and fair treatment; being familiar with every part of the country I would be in a position to deal fairly with each section. I believe in good roads, but with taxes piling up mountain high I would economize on these expenditures as well as all others. I look upon the matter as impossible in this sparsely settled country to build as good roads as in the eastern states where population and wealth are a hundred fold greater than here. For the same miles of road where we have one party and one thousand dollars of property to draw from, they have a hundred people and one hundred thousand dollars of property to draw upon.

I believe in our present condition that a road thrown up thoroughly drained and covered with a good coat of crushed rock and thoroughly rolled, sufficient for most of the roads in this county. At least I believe such a road is all the already over-burdened taxpayer can afford to build at this time. I am in favor of each road district choosing its road supervisor, and each road district should receive its part of the road money based on the taxable property in each district. Also, if I am elected I shall endeavor to get full value for every cent expended. I want full value without favor to anyone. I shall have no favors to bestow on anyone that does not return full value to the country. I have a deep interest in Lane county, and expect to make my home here for my allotted time, and your interests and my interests are mutual, what is for your benefit is for my benefit. Thanking those who have so kindly supported me without solicitation for the nomination, I promise all the voters and taxpayers, if elected, to give my whole and undivided time to their interests, and shall do my utmost to reduce your taxes and will greatly appreciate the honor if you should elect me county judge.
