HARD TO PHOTOGRAPH FISH.

Time and Plates Wasted on Pictures of the Aquarium.

"Of all the difficulties with which the amateur photographer has to contend in his search for novel subjects for his camera," recently remarked Custodian Spencer of the New York Aquarium,

"But it is not always the amateurs who are fooled," went on Mr. Spencer. "Quite recently a reporter on one of the illustrated dailies came here, accompanied by a staff photographer, and asked permission to make some pictures to illustrate a story.

"Now, when we wish photographs, we remove the fish from the exhibition tanks to an aquarium specially constructed for photographing purposes," indicating by a motion a group of long and extremely narrow aquariums resting on a table in the laboratory.

"One of our greatest difficulties heretofore has been our inability to photograph the living fish in their natural surroundings, for just so sure as we introduce seaweed, foliage, rocks or shells into the photographing tank, behind these objects the fish would anchor, and they acted generally as if they knew exactly what was taking place or had personal objections to sitting for their portraits.
