PLAGUE IS A COSTLY ONE.

Consumption Costs the Country an Im-

mense Amount Each Year. According to careful estimates made by Dr. Biggs, of New York, the ex ense of tuberculosis to the people of the United States amounts to \$330,000,-000 a year. Dr. Biggs first calculates the loss to New York City by putting a value of \$1,500 upon each life at the average age at which deaths from tuberculosis occur. This gives a total value of the lives lost annually of \$1,-500,000. But this is not all, for at least nine months prior to death these patients cannot work, and the loss of services at \$1 a day, together with food, nursing, medicines, attendance, etc., at \$1.50 a day, results in a further loss of \$8,000,000, making a yearly loss to the municipality of \$23,000,000. From the whole country the 150,000 deaths from tuberculosis represent in the same way a loss of \$330,000,000. Dr. Briggs also says that the total

expenditure in the city of New York in the care of tuberculosis patients is not over \$500,000 a year, i. e., not to exceed 2 per cent of the actual loss by lives annually, to say nothing of the ernormous saving in suffering." Further evidence of this is shown in the fact that in the last twenty years the total deaths from tuberculosis in New York have decreased instead of increased, notwithstanding that there has been an increase of 70 per cent in the general population.

Size of the Foot.

A well proportioned foot should be as long as the ulna, or chief bone of the forearm-that is, from the small head of the bone to be seen at the wrist to the point of elbow should be the length of the foot. Where the forearm is too short the foot will be found to be also too short; where this is too long the foot will be too long. Most people are surprised that the foot should be as long as the forearm, and are inclined to dispute the fact till they prove it by experiment; but an experiment will easily show that a straight line drawn from one point to another will appear a great deal longer than the same space filled by a line divided into curves.
