COUNTY SEAT NOTES

New Law Makes it Compulsory to Record all Births and Deaths

VOTED FOR BONDS

For the Purpose of Building Sewer System for Eugene

A medical license has been issued to Dr. James E. Hosmer and filed with the county clerk.

Marriage licenses have been issued to Chester O. Bean and Kathryn Brund, and Alvin Brown and Jennie Simmons.

Attorneys Jerome Knox and J. C. Johnson, and Messrs. Herbert Eakin and I. H. Bingham prominent citizens of Cottage Grove, were seen on our streets Tuesday.

Harry Brehaut of Cottage Grove a subject of the King of England has filed declaration papers with the county clerk to become a full-fledged citizen of the United States.

Brick masons commenced work Tuesday on the opera house building. Martin's brickyard has furnished a start in brick, and work will be rushed right along as rapidly as possible.

Friday the citizens of Eugene voted on the question of whether \$15,000 in bonds for construction of a main sewer in the western part of town should be issued or not. The vote was light but the bonds carried by a vote of 132 for to 59 against.

Miss Gertrude Sovern, who with her parents Mr. and Mrs. Brannon, formerly resided at College Hill, South Eugene and who has been spending the winter in California, was run down and killed by an engine on the railroad near Santa Rosa, Cal., Wednesday. She was 19 years old and highly respected here.

Ida Heinrich, a single woman aged 22 years, was brought down from Cottage Grove Tuesday and examined before Judge Kincaid by Drs. L. W. Brown and W. L. Cheshire and pronounced insane. She was taken to Salem on the morning train Wednesday. The complaint was made by the woman's father, Frank Heinrich, and the cause of insanity is hereditary.

The Eugene league team played Roseburg Saturday and Sunday the

first game resulting in the score of 25 to 8 and the second 15 to 10, both in Roseburg's favor. Salem won two games from Albany, clearly demonstrating that the Capital City Raglans have the superior team of the league. Not half the games have yet been played and there is time for Eugene to reach the top of the list. Wait 'til we get our second wind.

Miss Marie Ware, ex-commissioner of the land office in Eugene, was arrested at Portland Wednesday on a charge of fraud in office on a warrant issued in the federal court. Horace McKinley, her close friend, who is generally believed to have prospered over her peculations was arrested Tuesday evening. They have been released on bonds of \$2000. The government officers who are running down land frauds in this state are of the opinion that Miss Ware has surrendered herself to the influences of designing speculators, who have found her a ready tool. Government officers do not desire to prosecute her, if she will become a witness for the government. They believe that speculators who have used her to further their designs should rather be brought to justice. If any of the charges against her can be substantiated, it will probably be manifest that she has not made herself liable by acts of her own initiative, but by the promptings of persons who have found her plastic in their hands. Friday, June 19, is the date set for the preliminary hearing of McKinley and Miss Ware at which time O'Day & Tarpley will appear as counsel for the defense.

It is necessary now to make official record of every birth and every death. A new law that is already in effect, requires every physician, midwife or head of the family to give notice by the end of the month to the county health officer of any birth that occurs under his or her charge. Every physician, midwife or head of a family must give notice to such health officer within 48 hours of every death. No burial can take place until a proper burial certificate has been made out and transmitted to the county health officer. All these requirements are the result of the act creating the state board of health, which passed the last legislature. It contained an emergency clause, and took effect on its approval by the governor. It creates a county, as well as a state health board. The county board is the county judge and county physician. If there is no county physician, as is the case in some counties then the county judge is the county board of health as well as the county health officer.

HERMANN IS ELECTED

Will Carry the District by a Plurality of About 2400 Votes

USUAL MAJORITY

Maintained by Republicans in Proportion to the Full Vote

The election passed off quietly at Cottage Grove about a two-thirds vote being cast. The light vote here was more due to the voters being extremely busy in the mills, timber camps and mines, than to any apathy toward any particular candidate, and the same may be said regarding the vote of the whole district. West Cottage Grove is always close and there was no exception to former elections in this respect. The vote as cast in the two precincts is as follows: West Cottage Grove, Hermann, 84; Reames, 78; Elmore, 10; Ingle, 5; Total 177. Hermann's majority over Reames 6. East Cottage Grove: Hermann, 154; Reames, 95; Elmore 13; Ingle, 13. Total 276. Hermann's majority over Reames 59. Total majority for Hermann in both precincts 65.

THE DISTRICT.

The vote of the district shows a falling off of about 30 per cent from the usual vote, but Hermann's plurality for Congress will be from 2300 to 2400. Fuller returns from the outlying counties have increased his vote over early estimates. In the neighborhood of 30,000 votes were cast, as against 45,000 last year, a falling off of 33 per cent. The plurality of Reames in Clackamas is 252, a gain for Hermann of 100 over first estimates. Curry shows up with something like 125 plurality for the republican candidate, and Douglas his home county, gives Hermann the handsome margin of 500. Josephine declares for Reames by 185 plurality, while Klamath and Lake exceed expectations by piling up for Hermann pluralities of 123 and 171, respectively. Hermann is popular in Yacima Bay, and Lincoln county is in his column by 239. Linn, the democratic stronghold, flops over into the republican ranks by 88 plurality while Polk breaks former records for good republican behavior and gives Reames 81. Marion is for Hermann by 150, a little better than early returns showed, and

Washington does well with 387 for the Douglas county man. Yamhill, which was first reported a standoff is 54 for Hermann.

All these changes bring the first estimate of 1800 republican plurality in the First District up to 2357, which will probably be very near the final figures.
