He also sold at the same time part of the Troy farm to Rinehart Antis, who in turn sold that part to John Milligan. John McDowell lived in the log house still standing. Magnus Murray purchased the farm in 1815 and it was sold by the sheriff to John Reed in 1822 for \$7,000. 
