KILLED TO SAVE HER SOUL

Strange Case of Frederick C. Fischer, the California Wife-Merderer. Frederick C. Fischer, barber, preach r, political organizer, grand larceny thief, burglar, highwayman, bigamist, wife murderer-who was hanged at San Quentin prison for chloroforming. choking and burning his wife to death, Miss Curtain of St. at Riverside, Cal.—has been labeled "The Human Mystery."

The puzzling psychological features in his case consist of his undoubted sincerity as a church member and reworker while he was also a thief, both in the East and West-for he has preached in every prison he has ever been in-and of his desertion of the wives he did not love and killing of the only one he cared for.

His story, verified in part, was that he told his wife he was a bigamist and feared arrest, asking her to go away and remain in seclusion while he gave himself up and served his time, then he would rejoin her and they could live happily without a recurrence of the fear that was then overshadowing him. suicide if he was arrested.
