TRANSANDEAR RAILWAY.

Work on New Road Is Being Pushed on Both Sides of Mountains.

lean congress, which closed in February, a bill was passed providing for the construction of a railway over the Andes Mountains, to connect Buenos Ayres with Santiago and Valparaiso. This will be the first line to cross the continent of South America. This railway was projected twenty years ago, and since that time some sort of meas are dealing with the question has been before each session of Congress; but each in its turn failed to pass one or the other branch of the law-making body until Feb. 28 last, when the above-mentioned bill became a law. A railway extending from Buenos Ayres to the Cumbre of the Cordillera, at Uspallata Pass, to connect with the line from Valparaiso, is being constructed by the Argentine government. Work on the new road is being pushed forward on both sides of the mountains, and prospects are bright for direct railway connections within a few years between the Atlantic and Pacific coasts over the Andes, by a line extending through the heart of Chile and Argentina. This road will shorten the time between Europe and Chile by six or eight days, as traffic is now via the Strait of Magellan.


