MONEY SPENT BY COUNTY.

Over \$80,000 in Warrants Issued Dur-
ing the Year.

County Judge H. R. Kincaid fur-
nishes the following figures on the ex-
penditures made by the county com-
missioners' court for all purposes
during the year, 1903.

The total number of claims audit-
ed and allowed during the year
1903, as shown by the number of
warrants drawn by County Clerk E.
U. Lee, were 4,631.

The total amount of all expenses
of the county during the year 1903,
as authorized in 4,631 warrants
drawn and shown by the clerk's
books was \$82,868.27.

The total amount expended by the
county on the roads during the year
1903, as shown by the clerk's books,
was \$27,873.89.

The total amount expended by the
county on bridges during the year
1903, as shown by the clerk's books,
was \$11,599.79.

The approximate indebtedness of
Lane county, Dec. 31, 1903, as shown
by the clerk's books, is \$89,524.89.
This is a gradual decrease of indebt-
edness, with more money spent on
roads and bridges than in former
years, and shows the county to be
in fine condition financially.—Guard.

ation and Building for
Cottage Grove.

The policy of the Y. M. C. A. in
Oregon to hold down the number
of organizations bearing its name to
those rich enough to have the mod-
ern appliances necessary to carry on
the work is receiving its reward at
last, said Sundays' Oregonian.

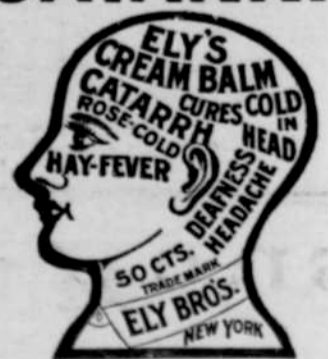
Within the past week four applica-
tions have come in to Harry W.
Stone, executive member of the state
board of the Y. M. C. A. asking per-
mission to build association build-
ings from cities qualified to do so.
These are from Eugene, Astoria,
Pendleton and Baker City. An ap-
plication from Cottage Grove has
also been received by the state board
of the Y. M. C. A. for what is known
as an industrial association. These
are only established, in fact, in
towns, the building usually being

given by the local manufacturers.
The most conspicuous instance of
this kind of an association is in the
marble town of Proctor, Vt., the
marble quarries near which are
owned by Senator Proctor from that
state.

An organization of this kind is
only awaiting permission from the
state board to be built at Cottage
Grove. This movement has been
in progress in this city ever since
last summer when an editorial in the
Leader called attention to the ur-
gent need for such an organization
and institution in Cottage Grove.
The movement has the backing of
the substantial citizens of the town
and bids fair to materialize.
