goes to organize a Lincoln Annuity
Union Lodge at that place.

The local option bill which will be
submitted to a vote at the June elec-
tion, provides that elections may be
held in any county or any precinct or
any subdivision of a county to deter-
mine whether the sale of intoxicating
liquors shall be prohibited therein. It
prescribes the duties of public officers
in relation to enforcement of this law;
provides for the issuance by the county
court of orders prohibiting the sale
of intoxicating liquors within certain
limits. It limits the time within which
the question of prohibiting such sale
of intoxicating liquors may again be
submitted to vote in the same district;
provides penalties for the return to
any liquor dealer of a proportionate
amount of any license fee which he
may have paid, whenever the district
in which he shall be engaged in busi-
ness shall be declared to be prohibi-
tion territory.

It is estimated that the output of
Oregon in mining for 1903 is approxi-
mately \$10,000,000. About half of this
amount was taken from the mines of
Southern Oregon, the balance from
Eastern Oregon.
