Decidedly False Economy.

The LEADER understands that some of the city councilmen are advocating limiting the use of the city water supply this season to domestic purposes only, thereby prohibiting the beautifying of lawns and flower gardens, the sprinkling of streets, and the operation of water motors about town, from the fact that the city has grown to such an extent in the past few years that the demand for city water is greater than the supply with the present system. However it is a well known fact that by the replacing of the present four inch main with a six or eight inch main from the reservoir west of town to the new system in the western suburbs, the supply would be more than equal to the present demand. Therefore the question naturally arises, does the present city board advocate the adoption of measures which will retard the advancement of the town or keep it at a standstill? Is it satisfied to remain in the old rut, while other progressive valley towns are forging ahead, simply from the fact that to keep up with the march of progress, means the outlay of a few hundred dollars, all of which, however, is returned to the city in the way of a greatly increased water revenue. The LEADER, as well as the Nugget, has incurred an outlay of \$100 in putting in Pelton water motors for the operation of printing presses, upon the assurance that water for their operation would be supplied by the city, the shutting off of which supply would render practically valueless, this investment and force an additional expense of over \$100 upon the local papers in installing gasoline engines. The most deplorable features of this mossback, retrogressive, economical(?) contemplated order, however, is the fact that the pride that has been inspired in the beautifying of Cottage Grove homes by the cultivation of ornamental shrubbery and lawns would be shattered and little encouragement in home-building would be afforded. Such an order as the one contemplated is a poor argument for municipal ownership of light and water plants. There is not a company or corporation in the state in control of such utilities, but what would keep up with the public demand and march of progress in this respect, regardless of cost, and if the authorities of Cottage Grove cannot do likewise, they had better sell out to some company or corporation and get out of the business.
