### Four Convictions for Killing Game.

Game Warden John W. Baker returned home from McMinnville Saturday where he went to prosecute four parties for a violation of the game law, two pleading guilty to a charge of killing birds out of season and the other two pleading guilty to deer killing and they were fined from \$15 to \$25 and cost. The two parties pleading guilty to killing birds out of season committed a somewhat unusual offense, the one having killed a large white swan and displaced it on the streets of McMinnville in the presence of the game warden, not knowing he had violated the law. The other's offense consisted of killing wild geese. The game warden has knowledge of other violations down the valley for which the offenders will be prosecuted as soon as sufficient evidence can be secured to convict them.

On reaching the New Era drug store a flying sign-tree and harness became tangled about the hind leg of the horse and he fell prostrate on the sidewalk where he was untangled and turned over to his owner, considerably bruised up. The other horse was caught west of town and returned to its owner. Considerable damage resulted to the wagon, team and sidewalk.
