

A WORD WITH THE VOTERS OF OREGON

Republican State Central Committee, Portland, Or., May 21—If the electors of this state will but appreciate the importance of the first gun to be fired off this Presidential year, and will avail themselves of an opportunity to show their appreciation of President Roosevelt and his policies, and their appreciation of the doctrine of the Republican party of this state as enunciated in the platform adopted by the recent State Convention, they will see to it that a full vote is polled on the 6th day of next month. Gain Over 400 Over Two Years Ago
